Ambika Aiyadurai is an Associate Professor in Humanities and Social Sciences at IIT Gandhinagar. She is an anthropologist of wildlife conservation with an interest in human-animal relations and community-based conservation. Ambika has more than 20 years of research on human dimensions in wildlife conservation with a special focus on Northeast India. She completed her PhD in Anthropology from the National University of Singapore and is trained in natural and social sciences with an MSc in Wildlife Sciences from the Wildlife Institute of India, Dehradun, and in Anthropology from University College London. Her research is at the intersection of human-animal studies, environmental humanities and marginalization. Her publications include *Tigers Are Our Brothers: Anthropology of Wildlife Conservation in Northeast India* (Oxford University Press, 2021) and the edited volume *Beings and Beasts: Human-animal relations at the 'margins'* (Cambridge University Press, 2025).
