Select an option tentatively. <table border="1" style="width: 100%; border-collapse: collapse;"> <tr> <td style="width: 5%; text-align: center;">i)</td> <td>In any of the options, first stage of the project (MTP-I), shall be divided into two parts of 12 credits each.</td> </tr> <tr> <td style="text-align: center;">ii)</td> <td>Part-1 of MTP-I (e.g., XY6091 Project – I(A) 0-0-12-12) will start right after the first semester, at the beginning of December, and continue till the end of the second semester. In Part-1, students can lay the foundations, conduct a literature survey, formulate the problems, and initiate the project work, working full-time in the winter semester break and simultaneously with coursework in the second semester.</td> </tr> <tr> <td style="text-align: center;">iii)</td> <td>Option-A (Internship during the 4th Semester): Part-2 of MTP-I (e.g., XY6092 Project – I(B) 0-0-12-12) will be during the Summer Vacation (May – July), after the 2nd Semester. The second stage of the project (MTP-II) shall be divided into two parts of 12 credits each. While complete/majority of the MTP-II execution shall happen during 3rd Semester as Part-1 of MTP-II (e.g., XY6093 Project – II(A) 0-0-12-12), the student shall complete any minor/leftover part of the project remotely and write the thesis as Part-2 of MTP-II (e.g., XY6094 Project – II(B) 0-0-12-12), while s/he is doing the internship during the 4th Semester. In this option, the student can defend the thesis as per the timelines of the Academic Calendar (in May/June) and continue the internship even for more than five months.</td> </tr> <tr> <td style="text-align: center;">iv)</td> <td>Option-B (Internship during 3rd Semester): In this option, a student shall complete Part-2 of MTP-I (e.g., XY6092 Project – I(B) 0-0-12-12) during the Summer Vacation (May – July), after the 2nd Semester. Then the student will proceed for an internship in the 3rd Semester and work during August – December, s/he will return to the campus for the 4th Semester and work on MTP-II as usual.</td> </tr> <tr> <td style="text-align: center;">v)</td> <td>Option-C (Internship during Summer Vacation and Onwards): In this option, right after the 2nd Semester, a student shall proceed for an internship for about five months during the Summer Vacation and until the end of September. Such students will return to the campus and execute Part-2 of MTP-I during October – December.
