CONCEPT NOTE

Developing countries are more prone to disasters due to various challenges like poverty, lack of resources, lack of educational opportunities, poor infrastructure, lack of trained workforce, and lack of awareness. Disaster risks are growing more intense, complex, and unpredictable.

The key findings of the recent IPCC 6th Assessment Report are that extreme events, such as droughts, fires and floods, are increasingly compounding, likely due to human influence.

On the 13th of October, The **INTERNATIONAL DAY FOR DISASTER RISK REDUCTION** is celebrated. It promotes a worldwide culture of risk-awareness and disaster reduction, as well as recognise how people and communities throughout the globe are decreasing their vulnerability by being aware of the environment and making conscious decisions to avoid catastrophes and joining hands in sensitising the nation about the significance of mitigating the risks through the sustainable solution. The International Day for Disaster Risk Reduction is a beam of light giving hope to appreciate the progress made toward reducing disaster risk and losses in lives, livelihoods, and health and seeking a better and brighter future to build back more sustainably. On DRR day, we celebrate how people and communities work collectively and actively to reduce their exposure to disasters by raising awareness, sensitising the masses, preparedness and building capacity at the local level.

This year our theme is "**Early warning and Early Action for all**". Technical interventions can achieve it with meaningful engagement with at-risk communities.

What is CDMR?

CDMR stand for Centre for Disaster Management and Research, it is a multidisciplinary centre working purely on the disaster management related fields.

CDMR was established in IIT Guwahati on November 2020 after the Honourable Prime Minister of India, Shri Narendra Modi Ji, emphasized the need for such a centre in North East India, which witnessed several hazardous events.

The Centre not only contributes through research, innovation, consultancy, capacity building and advocacy in various disciplines but also addresses the need for adaptation to climate change and Disaster Mitigation.

Measure thrust area of CDMR are Earthquake, Landslide, Flood, Climate Change, Impact of disaster on gender and Socio Economy, CBRN (Chemical, Biological, Radiological and Nuclear), Cyber Security and Remote Sensing.

The centre aims to achieve excellence in key areas of education and research at par with international standards.
