It may be mentioned that, as the strength of students keeps changing throughout the year, sanctioned faculty strength also changes while calculating at different times of the year. Because of the variable nature of data, vacancy positions will also change, making it difficult to keep track of the category-wise vacancy positions. As such, earmarking/calculation of the vacancy positions will be done on the basis of the students' strength (as of 1st April) at the beginning of a particular financial year and will be used till the end of that financial year.

Item No 9

To consider the proposal for setting up an academic centre, viz., Centre for Sustainable Water Research.

It was apprised to the Board that on behalf of 25 faculty members from 8 departments of the Institute, Prof. Mihir Kumar Purkait, Dept of CE submitted a proposal for setting up an academic centre on "**Sustainable Water Research**" which would emphasize on research, education and service in the 163rd meeting of the senate held on 13.09.2022. The Board noted the vision and mission of the proposed centre as follows:

<u>Vision</u>: To envision a holistic and trans-disciplinary academic centre that encourages traditional, novel and trans-disciplinary research and development in sustainable water research.

Mission:

- a) To strengthen core research culture in science and technology, education and water policies.
- b) To resolve key issues associated with sustainable water, particularly in NE states.
- c) To develop a generic model for the integration of water quantity, quality, economics, and policies.
- d) To enhance interaction among academia, R&D labs, Industries and NGOs.
- e) To augment the multi-disciplinary research and pedagogy in all subjects of sustainable water.
- f) To foster joint academic research exchange and training programme on sustainable water quality and quantity.

The highlight of the objectives, scopes and activities of the proposed Centre is as follows

• The centre would offer various academic programmes, viz., Ph.D, Online M.Tech in "Sustainable Water Future", M.S(R) in Water Science and Technology.

- The centre would offer various training and certificate programmes for water professionals and researchers.
- The centre would take up research projects on diversified areas of water.
- The centre would coordinate active interaction with NE state Govts and Central Govtto venture into translational trans-disciplinary projects in the broad field of sustainable water.

The Board also noted that the Australia India Water Centre (AIWC) will be an integrated part of the proposed Centre at IIT Guwahati and the Western Sydney University will be the Nodal Institute in Australia to run the joint programmes. Further, the Centre would plan to offer Joint degree in Master of Sustainable Water Futures and Joint PhD degree programmes with Western Sydney University.

The Senate in its 163rd meeting deliberated on the matter at length and approved the proposal given at <u>Annexure-8</u> (pg.48-72), and recommended the same to the BOG for approval vide resolutionR.163/3/2022. Further the Senate suggested to plan the academic programmes in a careful manner by stating one at a time. Once the centre is established, the centre may make detailed proposals on academic programmes through proper channel.

The Board was requested is approve the recommendation of the 163rd meeting of Senate to consider the proposal for setting up an academic centre, viz., Centre for Sustainable Water Research.

The Board discussed and resolved as below:

Vision

To develop a comprehensive state-of-the-art research, innovation, knowledge dissemination and support centre for Analytics and Research using UAVs and Drones.

<u>Mission</u>

Appropriate and effective methods of knowledge and capacity building in public domain through research, innovation and training to ensure collation of airborne data of social and scientific interests for resolving, monitoring and mitigation of emergency situations as well as serving social, economic and political interests of the region and the country.

The Board also noted that the name of the center was inaugurated by Hon'ble MoS, Civil Aviation in November 2021.

It was also apprised to the Board that the Senate in its 163rd meeting, examined the proposal and opined that the centre can be established as an Academic Centre rather than a Centre for Excellence.

Further, the Senate opined that the name of the centre could be the Centre for Drone Technology. Accordingly, the Senate vide resolution R.163/14(a)/2022 approved to establish a new Academic Centre, viz., Centre for Drone Technology, as per the revised proposal as given at **Annexure-9** (pg.73-79) and recommended the same to place to the BOG for approval.

The Board was requested to approve the recommendation of 163rd meeting of Senate to consider the proposal for establishing the Center for Drone Technology.

The Board discussed and resolved as below:

Audit para "Irregular allowance of increment to newly recruited faculty members resulted in over payment."

The Board noted that in its 111th meeting held on 17.06.2022 it was resolved to form a committee to examine the matter of Audit Para raised as "Irregular allowance of increment to newly recruited faculty members resulted in overpayment". Accordingly, a Committee was formed.

Meanwhile, a letter from the Ministry of Education dated 03.10.2022 has been received. The Ministry has enquired about the status of the audit para and forwarded a letter from DGA (Central), Kolkata, where it was mentioned that IIT Kharagpur, has initiated recovery of overpayment with the approval of their Board of Governors, whereas in Guwahati, the matter was under deliberation and no recovery of pay and allowance has been made till date. Copy enclosed as **Annexure – 30** (pg.108-115)

The Committee constituted vide resolution of the 111th BoG has gone through all relevant documents including Ministry's letter dated 03.10.2022. After detailed deliberation, the Committee felt that a re-verification of the pay fixation of the faculty members as pointed out in the Audit para be carried out, and recovery, if applicable may be initiated. The recommendation of the Committee is enclosed as **Annexure – 31**(pg.116)

The Board noted that a committee has been constituted to examine the regularization of service of Junior Attendant appointed on contractual basis in IIT Guwahati with the following members:

- 1. Prof. A Srinivasan, Professor, Dept. of Physics, Chairman
- 2. Prof. Rajib Kumar Bhattacharjya, Dean (RGF), Member
- 3. Mr. Pranab Borgohain, Asst. Registrar, Legal Cell, Member
- 4. Mr. Dhrubajyoti Sharma, Jt. Registrar, Convener

Three (3) nos. of meetings were held to discuss about the above-mentioned subject. In the final and 3rd meeting of the aforementioned committee held on 20.10.2022, it continued the discussion on the regularization of service of Junior attendants appointed against Notification under reference No. IITG/R/10/2016 which was released for filling up 10 nos. of Junior Attendants (consolidated pay) from amongst the eligible candidates whose family had lost land during setting up of the Institute and the Notification under reference No. IITG/R/112/2016 which was released for filling up 10 nos. of Junior Attendant (consolidated pay) post for the applicants whose names had been forwarded through District Employment Exchange.

The Committee noted that at present there are twenty-six (26) Junior Attendants (20+ 6 from waiting list), who were appointed on consolidated pay against above referred Notifications on the basis of a common written test to draw a category wise merit list.

Further the Committee also noted that at present there are thirteen (13) vacant posts of Junior Attendants. As per current roster, the category wise break-up of the thirteen (13) vacant posts of Jr. Attendants following the percentage of reservation as applicable to the State of Assam and other DoPT guidelines are UR = 6, SC = 1, OBC= 5, EWS =1. In case, no EWS candidates are available, then the post can be filled up by an UR candidate.

As per the merit list drawn by the Selection Committee dated 10.08.2017 placed in the table as Annexure-34, a list of 13 candidates is prepared in order of merit accommodating the vacancy as per reservation as below.

Guidelines for faculty awards

1. Preamble

The IIT Guwahati Faculty awards were constituted in the silver jubilee year of the Institute and are intended to recognize, acknowledge, motivate and advertise the faculty members of the Institute who have excelled in teaching and research & development, and are awarded every year. The salient features of the faculty awards are mentioned below:

- · One award, spanning across all Departments, Schools and centres, and all age groups, is for excellence in teaching. This award is named "the Institute Award for Excellence in Teaching". The institute will felicitate the awardee either on Teachers Day or the Institute Foundation Day.
- One award for a young (viz., at most forty years of age), and one award for a senior (viz., above forty years of age) Faculty of Engineering and Design comprising the departments of CSE, CE, CL, DD, EEE, and ME are constituted for excellence in research & development, and industrial consultancy. These awards will be named "the Institute Award for Excellence in Research & Development for Young Faculty (Engineering & Design)" and "the Institute Award for Excellence in Research & Development for Senior Faculty (Engineering & Design)"
- One award for a young (viz., at most forty years of age), and one award for a senior (viz., above forty years of age) Faculty of Science and Humanities comprising the departments of BSBE, CH, HSS, MA and PH are constituted for excellence in research & development, and industrial consultancy. These awards will be named "the Institute Award for Excellence in Research & Development for Young Faculty (Science & Humanities)" and "the Institute Award for Excellence in Research & Development for Senior Faculty (Science & Humanities)"
- Any regular faculty member (i.e., one who has completed the probationary period at the entry level) can apply for any of the awards in a relevant stream. The age at the time of the application is to be considered for choosing the relevant stream. The Faculty members of the Schools and Centres are also eligible to apply; they can apply in any age-appropriate stream.
- A Department, School or Centre can nominate one of its faculty members for the R&D awards. Nominations are expected to be made sparingly and should be in consequence only of nationally / internationally acclaimed outstanding recent R&D work by the nominee.
- The conduct and professional integrity of the applicant are expected to be beyond doubt.
- Performance and achievements in teaching of the faculty member in the five previous years of service in IIT Guwahati shall be taken into account in the selection for each Excellence in Teaching award with each year being counted from 01 July to 30 June.
- · Performance and achievements in R&D of the faculty member in the three previous years of service in IIT Guwahati shall be taken into account in the selection for each Excellence in R&D award with each year being counted from 01 July to 30 June. Achievements in foreign institutions other than collaborative research based on Memoranda of Understanding with IIT Guwahati will not be considered.
- Each awardee will receive a citation and a one-time cash prize of 1.0 lakh (Rupees one lakh only) in her/his Professional Development Fund. An awardee in Excellence in Teaching will not be eligible for another award in the same category for the next five years. An awardee in Excellence in R&D will not be eligible for another award in the same category for the next three years.

2. Selection Procedure:

Applications from and nominations for eligible faculty members will be invited by the Dean of Faculty Affairs at the appropriate time every year. Applications/nominations are to be made in the prescribed forms. A selection committee will scrutinize the applications/nominations and announce the awards. The decision of the selection committee shall be final.

- 1. Director, HT Guwahati (Chairperson)
- 2. Dean of Academic Affairs (Member)
- 3. Dean of Research & Development (Member)
- 4. Dean of Industrial Interaction & Special Initiatives (Member)

If any of the members is an applicant, he/she will be replaced by the corresponding Associate Dean (the senior Associate Dean if there is more than one Associate Dean)]

2(b). Selection criteria for Institute Award for Excellence in Teaching

Institute Award for Excellence in Teaching is given to a faculty member who has demonstrated excellence in classroom teaching, pedagogy, scholarship and mentorship during the previous five years. This award will be given to a faculty member of the Institute spanning all Departments, Schools and Centres. The assessment will be based on FIVE components with each carrying its own weightage. Cumulative points (P) earned under the following components will be used to prepare a table of eligible candidates. Only applicants with a minimum of 40 out of 100 will be considered for this award. The faculty member with the highest points will be adjudged the winner. In case of a tie, station seniority will be used to break the tie.

1: Background

The 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development and its 17 Sustainable Development Goals (SDG) call for action by all countries to improve the lives of people everywhere. Out of 17 SDGs, water management through innovative ideas, technology, and policy reform is essential for the establishment of most of the SDGs, such as 2(Zero Hunger), 3(Good Health and Well Being), 6 (water and sanitation), 7(Affordable Clean Energy) 9(industry, Innovation and Infrastructure), 11 (Sustainable Cities and Communities) and 13(Climate Action). While this reflects the increased attention on the water on the global political agenda, it also demands increased commitment from the academic institution to provide a platform for transdisciplinary research on the water to overcome the constraints faced in the water sector in achieving sustainable development. There is already a growing consensus that our water-related challenges will become more urgent over the coming years. The increasing demands of a growing population and a rapidly developing global economy, combined with the effects of climate change, will exacerbate the lack of adequate and safe water for both domestic and agricultural uses. It is also understood that the progress of a country towards the SDGs can partly be measured by assessing a country's water situation. Hence, social development and the economic prosperity of a country largely depend on the sustainable management of water.

2: Preamble

Experiences in dealing with water-related problems have shown that for arriving at an ecologically sustainable and efficiently implementable solution, consideration of various aspects relevant to the problem is necessary and therefore, it demands the expertise of different disciplines starting from engineering, agriculture, basic science, socioeconomics to policy. For example, a permanent solution to the urban flood problem of a city can be achieved by an engineering approach only if the socio-economic aspect of urban migration and encroachment to unfavourable habitats is addressed through policy decisions based on socio-economic and political research. Similarly, a properly designed water distribution system can be made more efficient operationally if leakage, head availability, etc., can be monitored through an IoT solution. In the same line, flood disaster at downstream of a hydropower dam can be managed efficiently with cloud triggered mathematical model fed with sensor-based information about the water level at critical locations, releases, etc., and guiding action of disaster manager accordingly. Similarly, the problem of groundwater depletion

and contamination, which is an extremely serious problem that needs to be addressed holistically and raising public awareness is equally important.

For the management of the freshwater ecosystem to derive ecological services in a sustainable manner, it is necessary to utilize expertise in aquatic ecology, eco-hydrology, and biology. The development of an innovative mechanized water application device or evapotranspiration control device might play a critical role in the efficient utilization and application of irrigation water. There is no end to such examples. Planning and implementation of multi-objective water resources projects need expertise cross-cutting across several disciplines such as engineering, environmental, sociology, economy and policy research. The list of such examples will never end, and with more and more experiences, people have realized that these problems can be addressed through transdisciplinary research to help sustainable and eco-friendly solutions.

Brahmaputra river

The river is braided and unstable in its entire reach in Assam except for a few locations. The instability of the river is attributed to high sediment charge, steep slope and transverse gradient. Apart from these, the entire area is in a seismic zone and quite often receives earthquake shocks of moderate to severe intensity. The problem further gets aggravated due to landslides caused by high rainfall. Some manmade avoidable actions in the form of shifting cultivation and non-scientific commercial exploitation of forest, etc. have also accelerated the process of soil erosion in the catchments. The silt brought in due to erosion in the hill catchment gets deposited as it enters into the plains of Brahmaputra Valley due to sudden reduction in slope with the consequent reduction in the flow velocity and sediment carrying capacity. Due to heavy deposition of silt, the river frequently changes its course on its way. Excessive silt deposition has also given rise to braiding and meandering pattern in the alignment of the river system. 'Majuli Island', the largest inhabited river island is located in the Brahmaputra in upper Assam. The left bank tributaries of the river Brahmaputra originating from older geological regions of Arakan hill and Khasi hills with flatter slopes, are more stable as they carry less sediment of finer size. By hypsometric analysis of the tributaries depicts that the North bank tributaries indicate relatively young stage while the South bank tributaries indicate a mature stage. This has given rise to inherent tendency of river Brahmaputra to shift its course towards south and the river flows by the side of hills at many places along its left bank. The floods in Brahmaputra Valley is a recurring phenomenon and has been causing large scale devastations every year.

The associated faculty members of the proposed academic centre (TCSW) will work on the development of Inter-State Brahmaputra & Barak River Valley by planning and such other measures so as to achieve progress and utilization of water resources of Brahmaputra. The work will also be focused on the integrated management of flood and river basins of interstate / international rivers of NE region by involving expertise of domain experts, state of art knowledge & technology, working closely with State Governments and other Stake Holders.

Australia India Water Centre (AIWC)

IIT Guwahati has expert researchers from almost all of the disciplines. However, what is missing is a platform where a solution to a problem can be discussed with an open mind without keeping barriers of discipline. If any expertise is missing within the institute, such a platform will also provide an opportunity to involve researchers from the collaborative Institute. The centre will primarily focus on the problem of water in an Indian context; however, it will consider the water problem as a global issue, and research activities will be oriented accordingly with both national and international collaboration. The formation of the Australia India Water Centre (AIWC) in IITG Guwahati is one such example. The Australia India Water Centre (AIWC) is a virtual joint centre established by a consortium of Australian and Indian universities, research institutions and water businesses to promote cooperation and collaboration in water research, education, training and capacity building. The Centre will provide a platform for long-term partnerships and dialogue between Australian and Indian water researchers, policy-makers, industry partners and nongovernmental organizations to work together for a common goal. The AIWC will run as an integrated part of the proposed Centre on TCSW. TCSW is focused on collaboration in transdisciplinary research, capacity building and knowledge and technology transfer, particularly on aspects of water security, safe drinking water supplies, river health, water-energy, water for urbans and rural sector.

Jal Jeevan Mission (JJM) Chair Professor

Department of Drinking Water and Sanitation, Ministry of Jal Shakti, Government of India, had established a Chair Professor on 'Water Quality' in IIT Guwahati to promote collaborations (within academics, research institutions, various state and central government departments dealing water),

undertake state of the art research, conducting a training programme, initiating diploma and certificate course on various aspects of water, capacity building for the rural drinking water and sanitation sector to address sectoral challenges and facilitate in the achievement of 'Har Ghar Jal' and 'Open Defectation Free (ODF)' status of villages and to improve the levels of cleanliness in rural areas through solid and liquid waste management activities in rural India. Such research will form the basis for evidence-based policy and technological interventions in the water sector. The JJM-Professor Chair will also work on the following in the IITG:

- A. Technology demonstration Novel methods and techniques of water treatment to be employed at the site in pilot-scale to study its applicability and acceptance.
- B. Assessment of technology undertaken Evaluation of existing water treatment technologies.
- C. Performance evaluation of existing/under commissioning plant/scheme Assessment of water treatment plants (WTP) in working or commissioning phase.
- D. Renovation of abandoned WTP scheme Rejuvenation of defunct WTPs.
- E. Advisor for the water treatment of technologies Consultations for improving, retrofitting and implementing water treatment technologies.

Apart from the above, hands-on training/workshop for PHED personnel and seminars, symposiums and conferences in the field of water treatment technology will be undertaken by the JJM-Professor Chair. All the activities of JJM chair professor is falls on the scope of the Centre and all the capacity building programs will also run through this proposed TCSW.

Based on this experience, we believe that having a centre at IITG to address water-related problems in a transdisciplinary manner will go a long way in meeting our commitment to helping people by solving their problems in a true sense. Water professionals having the outlook of a transdisciplinary approach is also a need of the hour. With this background, we propose to have a "Transdisciplinary Centre for Sustainable Water" to carry out Transdisciplinary Research in Water at IIT Guwahati.

The proposed centre will first offer PhD programme. Details of the M. Tech and MS (Research) programme on sustainable water systems will be formulated by the centre postgraduate programme committee (CPPC) following the usual procedure (CPPC>IPPC>Senate) in due course of time.

Further, the centre can also actively contribute towards online M Tech degrees with other institutions under the platform of AIWC. In addition, the centre will also offer industrially and governance relevant certificate courses in subjects related to sustainable water. The centre will foster towards a harmonious integration of sustainability subjects described later in the document.

Overall, the centre plans the following initiatives:

- PhD Program from December 2022
- Online M Tech Program from July 2023 as a part of AIWC activity.
- MS (Research) will be started from July 2023.
- Research projects on diversified areas of water.
- Webinar series and short courses on the broad area of water research.
- Young Water Professionals training programme.
- Certificate Training Program for water professionals and researcher.
- Faculty and student mobility across the Universities and AIWC network institutes/universities.
- Active interaction with NE state Govts and Central Govt to venture into translational transdisciplinary projects in the broad field of sustainable water.

3: Vision and Mission of the Centre

Vision

To envision a holistic and transdisciplinary academic Centre that encourages traditional, novel and transdisciplinary research and development in sustainable water research.

Mission

- To strengthen core research culture in science and technology, education and water policies.
- b) To resolve key issues associated with sustainable water, particularly in NE states.
- c) To develop a generic model for the integration of water quantity, quality, economics, and policies.
- d) To enhance interaction among academia, R&D labs, Industries and NGOs.

- To augment the multi-disciplinary research and pedagogy in all subjects of sustainable water
- f) To foster joint academic research exchange and training programme on sustainable water quality and quantity.

4: Objective of the Centre

- To conduct collaborative and transdisciplinary research on water science, technology, and policy.
- To deliberate and converge on sustainable water solutions for the rural sector of NE states.
- To promote industry-institute interactions and to provide practical solutions to water issues.
- To enhance information and critical debate on water through multiple platforms such as seminars, talks, conferences, and workshops (online & offline modes)
- To establish collaborations within the institute as well as with other institutes, universities, government agencies, companies, and NGOs to promote water research and application.
- To extend consultancy services to various organizations to provide solutions to their waterrelated problems.
- To build and enhance the capacity of water professionals through training programs and short-term certificate courses.
- To offer academic programs with integrated and transdisciplinary approaches involving hydrological, biophysical, chemical, economic, institutional, legal, policymaking and planning aspects to address water challenges.
- To equip a new generation of water researchers with transdisciplinary perspectives on the water to contribute to the industry, academia, and society.

5: Thrust area of the centre

The centre will involve faculty members from all relevant departments and other Centers to constitute a group of coherent researchers to address water-related problems holistically. The expertise of the Core Faculty Members can be seen in Table 1. The centre will have three primary wings to carry out in-depth independent research. To address any problem in the field of water, relevant members from all these wings will do brainstorming to identify the core issues and thus will find a sustainable solution in a more holistic manner. The major research area of the proposed sustainable centre is shown in <u>Table 1</u>.

6: Research and Academic Programme

The centre proposed to have PhD research to address the water problem in a transdisciplinary manner. It will also have Post Graduate programme for water professionals/fresh graduates, preferably in a modular pattern. Each of the modules will be designed for a credit transfer-based Certificate Course, and students completing some specified modules will be offered a credit transfer-based Postgraduate Diploma, and a student completing all modules will receive an M. Tech Degree. The proposed flexible system will thus allow water professionals of different levels to join the course to have a certificate, P.G. Diploma and M. Tech Degree in their desired field. We envisage to formulate an M. Tech programme in a way that a candidate completing the programme will be able to address any problem of sustainable water in her/his relevant field.

Services

The centre will serve society, industry and academia in various forms. To bring awareness on the need for a holistic approach for addressing water-related problems, the centre will organize workshops, seminars, conferences, etc., by involving experts in different fields. Service towards solving water problems in a sustainable manner will be offered through R&D projects and consultancy services. The centre will provide a platform for brainstorming among global experts in all the wings of the centre and thus will generate a barrier-free discussion among experts from different relevant fields yet targeting a sustainable solution to water for a better future considering climate change.

7: The Australia India Water Centre (AIWC) as an integrated apart of the centre

The challenges associated with water are complicated as it includes technological choices, physical process, and socio-economic and political dynamics. Therefore, solutions to these challenges cannot be realized without an integrated and transdisciplinary approach. The water research group of IIT Guwahati is inspired by the wicked nature of water-related challenges. The Australia India Water Centre (AIWC) is committed to delivering world-leading research and developing the capacity of the next generation of water professionals.

The ATWC is multi-disciplinary and aims to provide transdisciplinary approach to tackling water challenges. It brings together people from different specializations so that problems requiring multi-disciplinary input can be addressed with the right expertise and in a holistic manner. For example, a multi-disciplinary approach can help to resolve the flood and drought problem faced due to large spatiotemporal variation in precipitation in a much better way. Such scope is elaborated below as an example.

In most places, floods during Monsoon and droughts during a lean period are increasing basically because of a reduction in basin storage due to anthropogenic factors like conversion of forest land to agricultural land and then to urban areas and so on. The widely adopted water solutions are unable to satisfy people's increasing need for water. As far as rainwater is concerned, some areas that are receiving too much rainwater in the monsoon experience floods and excess rainwater discharged into the sea without being utilized, while some other areas were receiving less precipitation

experience water shortage in the dry season. Hence, the solution lies in utilizing or conserving the abundant flood water, which otherwise runs off to the ocean without much utility. This can be achieved by storing this excess water both on the surface/subsurface (underground) and in coastal reservoirs. A solution to the world's water problem is to conserve the abundant rainwater, store it in underground or overground reservoirs and coastal reservoirs (as no more land for overground inland reservoirs is available), and use this water in areas that have occasional, inadequate rainfall, known to be drought-prone, or in those times of the year when water supplies become scarce. It is wise to invest in the storage of this excess flood water (which is reasonably diluted and cleaner) in the underground reservoirs (inland) and coastal reservoirs close to the place where the river joins the sea or in a series of small cascade reservoirs. For developing such a storage system, while the hydrological study can help in assessing water availability and identifying potential storage areas, a geotechnical expert can design innovative subsurface storage, water quality expert can look into the possibility of maintaining water quality in such storage for various uses. Similarly, if storage is made in small cascade reservoirs, the need and scope of its multipurpose use for agricultural, domestic, hydropower etc., can be addressed jointly by an expert from hydraulics, agriculture and socioeconomic field. Thus, both the water scarcity and flood problems can be alleviated by long-term holistic planning and infrastructure development for the benefit of future generations.

The above is just an example of the water problem. There can be numerous examples of this kind. Keeping this in mind, the core disciplines and the nodal person involved in the centre are:

The centre will have three coordinated focus areas:

Research: Fundamental, experimental and applied transdisciplinary research to seek solutions to water problems of national and international importance.

Education: Develop cutting-edge transdisciplinary M Tech courses, PhD programs and Post Doctoral Research to gain a holistic understanding of the water resources and the nexus of science, technology, politics and policy. These courses will be designed in consultation with the industry, and the provision of the internship will also be kept so that students completing these courses will be able to meet the requirement of present and future demand for manpower in the water sector.

Service: Provide support, guidance and technical advice in facilitating and designing water solutions and improving science and technology intervention and communications to bridge the science-policy knowledge gap.

8: State-of-the-art water-related Centres in India

The following is a list of some of the Centres/departments in India engaged in education and research in the field of water science and technology.

• Centre of AquaMAP, IIT Madras:

The Centre of AquaMAP at IIT Madras provides smart solutions for challenging water problems by designing scalable models and leveraging innovative technologies. The centre addresses chronic water issues through Grand Challenges and their successful translation into pilot projects. It set up a state-of-the-art Hydro-Informatics Laboratory. AquaMAP collaborates with other IIT Madras water research centres such as Sutram, International Centre for Clean Water (ICCW) - IIT Madras, PCoE on Water and Sustainability, and other partners. We hope collaboration with this referral centre will be a benchmark in water security, water quality and sustainable water management.

School of Water Resources, IIT Kharagpur

The School of Water Resources at IIT Kharagpur is one of the pioneer centres for education and training in water quality and quantity management. It aims at providing integrated and interdisciplinary approaches involving hydrological, environmental, chemical, biophysical, economic, institutional, and policy-planning aspects, to solve the ever-growing water-related challenges in domestic, agriculture and industry sectors. It aims to develop the knowledge, insight and engineering skills required to design, implement and evaluate water management policies and strategies. The school offers interdisciplinary full-time M.Tech. (in Water Engineering and Management) and PhD (full-time/part-time) programmes to the students, professionals and researchers from multiple disciplines. The School entertains professionals working in the water services sector in private organizations as well as in the water management-related departments of central and state governments for short-term training and specific project assignments. They are trained and encouraged to employ the latest technologies being used worldwide for analyzing and solving the real-field problems in the water sector.

Interdisciplinary Centre for Water Research, IISc Bangalore

The Interdisciplinary Centre for Water Research (ICWaR) at the Indian Institute of Science is established with an aim to address water-related issues that have formidable scientific challenges and significant practical relevance. Over the past several decades, the Institute has made high-impact contributions in the areas related to water science and technology, both at the large (country, regional and river basin) scales and at the small (watershed, experimental field and laboratory) scales. There is a significant multi-disciplinary strength available in the Institute to address a large number of critical issues related to water and make notable research contributions while simultaneously providing implementable solutions to a number of problems related to water management in the country.

Department of Water Resource Development & Management, IIT Roorkee

The department offers application-based Postgraduate Degree programmes in Water Resources Development and Irrigation Water Management for imparting training to in-service Engineers and Agricultural Scientists. The department is actively involved in research, development and extension activities in the areas of water resources, hydropower and irrigation management. The department provides consultancy services for irrigation, flood control, drainage, groundwater development and power sectors. The objective of the Department is to develop manpower that can take responsibility for sustainable development and environment-friendly management of the available water resources. Non-conventional methods for utilization of water, such as cropping system modeling & planning, inter-basin transfer, and groundwater recharge through rainwater harvesting, are specially incorporated into the course curricula.

· School of Water Resource Engineering, Jadavpur University, Kolkata

The school for Water Resources Engineering, Jadavpur University, functions as an interdisciplinary group in R&D activities on Water Resources Engineering. The centre is associated with the Departments of Civil, Mechanical, Electrical and Chemical Engineering and Geological Sciences. The School is offering a Master of Engineering course in Water Resources and Hydraulic Engineering at the Post-graduate level sanctioned by the All India Council of Technical Education (AICTE). The School has national and international links with different renowned universities and research organizations as regards to collaborative programmes.

Center for Water Resources, Jawaharlal Nehru Technological University Hyderabad

The aim of the Centre for Water Resources, Jawaharlal Nehru Technological University Hyderabad is to generate advanced technical manpower in order to develop techniques and methodologies by undertaking advanced research in the field of water and environment and to achieve symbiosis by undertaking participatory approaches. The centre has capabilities in ultramicro level water shed management using geomatics, demonstrative rainwater harvesting structures, development of a hybrid power generation model using rainwater, rooftop rainwater harvesting, use and artificial recharge in an urban scenario using geomatics and urban lake water quality monitoring.

9: Academic Programs in Sustainable Water Outside India:

The following is a list of some of the world-class centres/departments outside India engaged in education and research in the field of the sustainable water system.

Centre for Water and Environmental Biotechnology, Queensland University of Technology, Australia

The Centre for Water and Environmental Biotechnology is an internationally recognized centre of excellence in innovative water technology and management. An award-winning multi-disciplinary team and research portfolio cover the breadth of the urban industrial water cycle, achieving sustainable outcomes for the global water industry. University of Queensland research contributing to sustainable municipal wastewater treatment has won a prestigious industry award. The centre covers technologies and solutions that can achieve benefits across the entire urban water network, from drinking water to wastewater treatment and various integration concepts of decentralized solutions in the centralized networks. An increasing focus of their work is also on recovering resources through water recycling or direct separation and recovery of valuable compounds from urban water streams.

Water Resources and Hydrogeology (Hydro Program), Department of Earth System Science, Stanford University, USA

The group of the Water Resources and Hydrogeology groups aims at a range of topics, including the scientific basis for water resources management with a special interest in developing regions, eco-hydrology, global freshwater vulnerability, surface-groundwater interactions, groundwater allocation policy, fluid flow and solute transport processes, innovative simulation techniques, and cutting-edge technologies in hydrogeophysics and remote sensing for near-surface hydrology. The Hydro Group has taken the lead in developing the Global Freshwater Initiative through the Woods Institute for the Environment.

Columbia Water Centre, Columbia University, USA

The Columbia Water Center has several projects focused on the technological, organizational, financial and policy transition required for US wastewater and water reuse systems. The centre involves advanced treatment and monitoring technologies which have made onsite and distributed wastewater treatment and water reuse systems an increasingly feasible option in many locations. The various interns associated with the Water Center have conducted a review of viable wastewater and water reuse technologies that can be deployed at the household,

community or regional scale. The Columbia Water Center also successfully implemented decentralized reuse and treatment systems.

Research Center for Water Environment Technology, The University of Tokyo, Japan

The research centre promotes water environment research and research on water infrastructure in super-smart societies based on common international goals "Clean Water and Sanitation". The centre also promotes cutting-edge research in a cross-disciplinary and agile manner on the development of water quality control technology and new material, Water systems management such as sewer infrastructure development and urban flood risk management utilizing IoT sensing technology, and international water environment issues related to water and sanitation. They reorganized the single department of water environment technology into three as research and education departments related to water environment related to water quality control technologies and materials development, water system management and International Water Environment.

The Climate & Water Research Unit (CWRU), University College of London, UK

The Climate and Water Research Unit (CWRU) at UCL is a multi-disciplinary network of scientists examining the interaction between climate and terrestrial hydrological systems and working together to address fundamental questions pertaining to the characteristics and dynamics of the global hydrological system and their consequences for our life-support systems. The key focus of CWRU's research is the impact of climate change on the hydrology of river basins around the world and its implications for adaptation policy responses. CWRU's research presently seeks to advance scientific understanding in a number of strategic areas, including the impact of climate variability and change on groundwater and other basin stores (e.g. soil moisture and ice); impact of climate variability and change on ecological systems - most notably wetlands; metrics of freshwater availability (water scarcity).

Institute for Water Innovation – University of Toronto, Canada

The Institute for Water Innovation conducts research to address industrial, commercial, and domestic water challenges. They are an interdisciplinary group of researchers with the aim of developing innovations in water management, chemistry, treatment, and remediation. They are engaged in various aspects of water research, including water management, novel industrial operating strategies to conserve water, drinking water distribution optimization, water characterization, sensor development, chemical modelling of aqueous systems and various water treatment methods and characterization and water remediation. They also work on the engineering of "Green Infrastructures" (e.g. wetlands, bioretention cells) for the removal of contaminants in effluent streams.

· Centre for Water Research, NUS, Singapore

The centre addresses the R&D needs of water infrastructure development through a holistic approach on a multi-disciplinary platform. The aim of the centre is to conduct R&D on water and wastewater engineering and management and address the water infrastructure needs in Singapore as well as the regional countries, to translate breakthroughs derived from fundamental R&D into innovative water quality enhancement and water reclamation solutions, to collaborate with national and international institutions/centres on fundamental research and with key industry partners on applied R&D. and to engage in technology transfer to local and regional water infrastructure industry.

Water Institute, The University of Waterloo, Canada

The University of Waterloo is remounted on four decades of excellence in water-related research, education and innovation. Recognizing the collective excellence of water research programs at the University of Waterloo, the Water Institute was formed to coordinate and support the extensive group of university researchers, staff, students and partners and to bring them together within a single institutional setting. Ground-breaking, interdisciplinary research is taking place under the institute's research themes on water.

Center for International Water and Sustainability, Desert Research Institute (DRI), USA

DRI's Center for International Water and Sustainability (CIWAS) aimed at multi-disciplinary work in international water, sanitation and hygiene (WASH) and environmental resource management over the last two decades. Because CIWAS is uniquely situated –a centre with deep

WASH knowledge located at an environmental research institute—the Center is able to align a broad range of multi-disciplinary talent for capacity-building projects and research. Through CIWAS' work, DRI achieves its broader science for humanity mission of "increasing scientific knowledge and understanding of the earth's environment, promoting the preservation of diverse ecosystems, advancing responsible resource management, and improving human health and welfare." More than 400 highly-skilled scientists, engineers, technicians, students, and staff work collaboratively within and across four research divisions, focused on understanding and answering critical scientific questions about global climate change, water quality and availability, air quality, the sustainability of desert lands, life in extreme environments, education, and more.

10: <u>Details on the proposed Doctoral Programme at the Transdisciplinary Centre for</u> <u>Sustainable Water(TCSW)</u>

The structure of the doctoral programme in TCSW would be in line with the other doctoral programmes offered in the institute, like the Centre for Environment and the Centre for Nanotechnology at IIT Guwahati. Selected parts of the academic ordinances for PhD at IIT Guwahati are reproduced here for quick reference.

(A.1) Eligibility Criteria for admission into PhD Programme (in Centres)

- Master's Degree in Science/Engineering/Technology in a relevant area with a minimum CPI of 6.5 or 60% of marks.
- Bachelor's degree in Engineering/Technology in a relevant area with a minimum CPI of 7.5 or 70% of marks.
- Bachelor's degree from an Indian Institute of Technology (IIT) in a relevant area with a minimum CPI of 7.0.

(A.2) Doctoral Committee (DC):

 To monitor the progress of the research of a student, there will be a Doctoral Committee with the following composition:

- (i) Chairman: A faculty member other than the Supervisor(s) to be nominated by the Centre Postgraduate Programme Committee (CPPC)
- (ii) Member(s): Supervisor(s)
- (iii) Members: Two other faculty members, of which one should preferably be from another department
- The DC is constituted by the CPPC in consultation with the Supervisor(s) within one month
 from the date of appointment of the Supervisor(s). The list is sent to the Chairman, IPPC, for
 approval.
- Until the DC is constituted, the CPPC performs the duties of the DC.

(A.3) Categories of PhD Students

- Regular: A student in this category works full-time for his/her PhD degree. He/she receives
 an assistantship from the Institute or fellowship from CSIR/UGC or any other recognized
 funding agency.
- Sponsored: A student in this category is sponsored by a recognized R&D organization, academic institution, government organization or industry for doing research in the Institute on a full-time basis. The Institute does not provide any assistantship/fellowship.
- Self-financed: A student in this category works full-time or part-time towards the PhD
 Programme. The Institute does not provide any assistantship/fellowship.
- Project-staff: This category refers to a student who is working on a sponsored project in the
 Institute and is admitted to the PhD Programme to work on a full-time or part-time basis. The
 remaining duration of the project at the time of admission should be at least one year, and in
 another category, it should be at least 30 months. If the project gets completed before the student
 completes his/her PhD Programme, his/her category will be converted to that of SELFFINANCED unless he/she is granted an assistantship/fellowship from the Institute or any other
 agency.
- Part-time: A student in this category is a professionally employed person (including the staff of IIT Guwahati) who pursues the PhD Programme while continuing his/her service duties.
 The Institute does not provide any assistantship/fellowship to such a student.
- External: This category refers to a student employed in an R&D organization/academic
 institution/industry having adequate research facilities. The research work leading to the PhD

degree may be carried out largely in the parent organization of the candidate under a Local Supervisor from the organization but with the overall guidance provided by a faculty member (Institute Supervisor) of the centre in which he/she is registered. The Institute does not provide any assistantship/fellowship to such a student.

- Quality Improvement Programme: This category refers to a student selected under the Quality Improvement Programme (QIP) of the AICTE. The student works full-time in the PhD Programme as per the rules and regulations of QIP.
- Visiting: A student in this category is a registered student in another university/institute in
 India or abroad. The Institute does not award any degree to such a student.

(A.4) Course Work:

- The DC of a student prescribes the courses a student must register for every semester.
 However, the CPPC prescribes courses if the DC is not yet constituted.
- A student of the Engineering/Design/Technology Department with an entry-level qualification of a two-year Master's degree (after completion of 4-year Bachelor's degree) or three-year Master's degree (after completion of 3-year Bachelor's degree) registers for a minimum of 4 courses with at least 24 credits and has to obtain a CPI of at least 6.5.
- A student with an entry-level qualification other than that listed above registers for a minimum of 6 courses with at least 36 credits and must obtain a CPI of at least 6.5.

(A.5) Certificate Courses at TCSW

The proposed centre will also offer certificate courses on sustainable water. These courses will be aimed at industry professionals.

11: Job opportunity for the passed out students

Careers in water profession are in high demand. There are enough scopes for the passed out students to get jobs in the following areas.

- Integrated water resources and watershed management.
- Protection of groundwater from contamination.
- · Protection of surface water.
- Marine water quality.

- Aquaculture and food processing.
- Municipal water systems, including water treatment, water distribution, wastewater treatment and wastewater collection.
- Green building.
- Water quality education, communication, policy and planning.
- Water resources engineers, water quality scientists, and professionals in water quality communications, education, policy and planning.

Typically, the listed professionals make lateral career moves between different types of roles and employers, such as NGOs, governments, private industry, or consulting. Engineers, water systems operators, and green building professionals, follow more vertical career pathways. These workers progress from entry-level to senior level positions and through progressive management roles.

CENTRE FOR DRONE TECHNOLOGY

Introduction and Background

The very nature of the North Eastern region of the country and its terrain poses unique challenges and difficulties for its inhabitants in terms of geographical access, infrastructure development and monitoring of resources. Moreover, the region has the largest length of land boundary and has international borders with as many as five countries (Nepal, Bhutan, Bangladesh, China and Myanmar). This makes monitoring of the borders a difficult task. The remoteness of this region from mainland India also compounds to these challenges.

The North Eastern states also suffer from limited road and railway connectivity to far ends. Regular and frequent assessment of both natural resources and built infrastructure is a critical requirement of several key areas of social, economic, political and other national interests. Tea industry, ground based oil supply industry, land consolidation, internal security, food processing, biomass harvesting, communication and electricity towers, river hydrology, forest and wildlife sanctuary monitoring, etc. to name a few requires continuous monitoring and support. In addition, it is also well known that the region also suffers from unwanted migration, illegal encroachments, theft of natural resources etc.

Apart from this, unprecedented emergency requirements demand the establishment of supply pipelines of essential goods including medicines to remote and inaccessible areas in the region. Also, outburst of pandemics like Covid and locally-situated serious hazards and natural disasters of severe intensity (cloudburst, heavy downpour, civil disturbances, landslides, incursions, soil erosion, earthquakes, hail storms, etc.) are regularly experienced phenomena in the region.

All these lead to social problems changing the local cultural landscape of the region. This is also perceived as a threat to the indigenous communities and lands/properties of the region. Thus, these require immediate attention.

Substantial concerted efforts are required to move beyond investigation of alarming situations and cater to demands of the North Eastern region and the country. To minimize the adversities in emergency situations and to understand its impact from all perspectives, well-grounded goals, targets and strategies that would assist the affected population, are required. The solution lies in the study, analysis of the circumstantial responses of the affected individuals and stakeholders. Improvising

existing facilities, support systems, information availability are the long-term goals. To reach these goals, the current situation mandates the usage of modern technologies.

IIT Guwahati recognizes that drones and UAVs may enable cost-effective, superior and safe scientific solutions. Due to their versatility, they may serve as useful learning tools for advance knowledge, developing new and fast support systems, mitigating emergency situations, promote public welfare, and serve the regional interests. At the same time, these drones offer unique solutions to achieve national interests such as environmental health, safety, regulatory compliance, and security.

In global scenario, usage of UAVs and drones have been permeating in multiple civil domains and military applications. Over the last several years, governments of many countries of Europe, Asia, and American continents have made significant progress in developing UAVs that are designed to transport small, critical payloads to and from hard-to-reach areas. Drone technology has been used successfully in precision targeting applications by the armed forces. As on today, UAVs is a potential part of a responsive and resilient health network to address longstanding transportation challenges for medical supplies. UAVs can increase access to quality health services by increasing coverage, access and reach with a focus on rural areas of North East.

North Eastern region has been experiencing many issues concerning with accurate mapping of land resources for achieving undisputed title deeds, unnecessary litigations, and poorly distributed economic activity. Also, unreasonable cartographic assumptions especially at uninhabited places invite severe inter-state border issues involving state authorities in the region. Hilly regions are also demarcated with many crisis issues of basic amenities, labour cost arbitrage, and poorly served businesses practices. In addition, poor infrastructure and challenging geography further enhanced above problems and turned these into social, administrative, and political problems. To manage these problems with ease and effectiveness, the usage of drones and UAV technology are imperative. With friendly drone regulatory policy and production govt of India has eased the processes for manufacturing, assembly, and deployment of drones. It is envisaged to be leading industry in the country. With time, skilled manpower, resources, and field workers will be required as 1,00,000 jobs will be generated over the coming five to seven years. This equates to almost 750-900 jobs in a month.

Keeping this background and challenges in focus, IIT Guwahati proposes to establish a new independent academic and research centre named "Centre for Drone Technology" for training, research and academics. The centre offers to provide skilled manpower to state and national agencies through PhD programme, training and Certification Courses in drones and UAV systems for augmenting capabilities in array of activities.

The proposed centre will comprise of various facilities and infrastructure for drones and UAV systems. Also, the centre will have domain experts and faculty members from Aerospace Engineering, Civil Engineering, Computer Science & Engineering, Electronics & Electrical Engineering, Artificial Intelligence, Nanotechnology, Geoinformatics (Geomatics), Mechanical Engineering, Robotics, Systems Engineering, Health Sciences and Social Science & Engineering. The centre will also undertake various training programs of short and long durations for surveys, mapping, pilot courses, public awareness, knowledge distribution at many academic levels from students to field professionals aspiring for promising career in UAVs and drone technology. Various research and consultancy projects will be carried out through sponsored funding from Government of India, state authorities, corporates, public and private parties, and National and International funding agencies.

Vision

To develop a comprehensive state-of-the-art research, innovation, knowledge dissemination and support centre for analytics and research using UAVs and drones.

Mission

Appropriate and effective methods of knowledge and capacity building in public domain through research, innovation and training to ensure collation of airborne data of social and scientific interests for resolving, monitoring and mitigation of emergency situations as well as serving social, economic and political interests of the region and the country.

Objectives and Philosophy

The primary objective of the multi-disciplinary centre is to develop skilled human resources, improve community participation and creating a knowledge centre through group research involving all stakeholders encompassing State Agencies, Armed Forces, Research Groups, Educational Institutes, Private Parties and Communities of this region.

- Developing domain expertise through PhD programme and Certification Courses in specific application areas involving drones and UAVs
- Skilled human resource development through regular trainings and workshops
- Research into state-of-the-art drone technologies and application domains
- Innovation in solving regional problems on demand with agility
- Assist the government agencies, armed forces and local communities
- Generating a pool of inter-disciplinary resource persons that can work with coordination to address the problems faced by local communities during various emergency situations and crisis

- To help the Government agencies in policy matters for the apt use of airborne data and drone technology
- To extend innovative, technical & research-based support in different projects in the form of consultancy

With this background, IIT Guwahati proposes to establish a new independent academic and research centre named "Centre for Drone Technology" for training, services, research, development and academics. The centre offers to provide skilled manpower to state and national agencies through training on various aspects of drones.

The new centre would offer PhD programme and Certification Courses in UAVs and drone systems for nation building.

These academic programs will be supported by faculty members from various Disciplines/Departments/Centres/Schools of IIT Guwahati with relevant teaching and research expertise.

The capacity building through PhD programme will take care of long-term research or innovation agenda. Various certification courses and training programmes, especially for the North Eastern States, will be apt to achieve the short-term goals.

Certification Courses: Various certification courses (depending upon the skills, level of expertise and time duration of courses) will be designed for Drone related research and development. Such courses are related to various areas, namely, sensor development for drones, pilot trainings for drone operations and application areas like forensics, environmental forensic, police investigation, land record management, roads and highway monitoring, railways, topographic surveys, emergency information collection and response, disaster potential and effect evaluation, natural resource exploration, synthetic simulations, etc. Courses are proposed to kick start in July 2023.

Potential Clientele: Students from IITs, NITs, Universities, CSIR institutes etc. Professionals from Industry, NGOs, Govt. Agencies, and Corporates (e.g., Geoknow, GMR Infra, Survey of India, Geological Survey of India, Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs, Directorate of Land Records and Administration, Power Grid, Ministry of Road Transport and Highways of India, Police Dept, Environmental Forensics, ISRO, DRDO, Indian Army, Dept of Inland Water Transport, Ministry of Rural Development, etc.)

NOTICE INVITING APPLICATION FOR EMPANELMENT OF ADVOCATES

Indian Institute of Technology Guwahati, incorporated under the Indian Institute of Technology (Amendment) Act, 1994 (35 of 1994) is an autonomous body under Ministry of Education, Govt. of India. Indian Institute of Technology Guwahati is a premier institute of higher education which was established in 1994 in Guwahati. It is governed by the Institutes of Technology Act, 1961 which have declared IITs as Institutions of National Importance and lays down their powers, duties, and framework for governance etc. The Institutes of Technology Act, 1961 lists twenty-three institutes (after the last amendment in 2016).

Applications are invited in prescribed format from eligible Advocates for empanelment to represent IIT Guwahati before different Courts of Law and provide legal advices on various matters as decided by the Competent Authority.

GUIDELINES FOR EMPANELMENT OF ADVOCATES

Before filling the application form given in **ANNEXURE-I**, the Advocates are advised to carefully read and follow the eligibility criteria, instructions and terms & conditions for empanelment in IIT Guwahati as mentioned herein below:

Eligibility of Empanelment

- a) Bachelor degree in Law from a recognized University and registration with Bar Council of India.
- b) Have a minimum, relevant experience of fifteen years of handling civil/criminal/service/IPR/land related matters before competent Hon'ble Courts/quasi-judicial forums like consumer forums, arbitral tribunals etc.

- c) Have good communication/drafting skills in English and good knowledge of law and procedure, in civil and criminal matters.
- d) The Advocates should be familiar with various branches of law especially those concerning laws of matters related to various writs, PIL, Land Disputes/Constitutional/ Service Law/Contract Law/ Property Laws and Taxations/IPR/consumer forum etc.
- e) Preference will be given to Advocates who have dealt earlier with Government Funded Educational Institutes / Government Funded Higher Education Institutes / Universities / Government Department cases (writ petitions / appeals) in Hon'ble Supreme Court / Hon'ble High Court and Hon'ble District Courts.
- f) The Advocates should be well conversant with Prevention of Corruption Act, Central Vigilance Commission Act, Indian Penal Code, RTI Act etc. and Procedural Codes.

Tenure of Empanelment: -

The initial empanelment will be for **one year**. Performance of empaneled Advocates shall be reviewed periodically or on annual basis. However, on completion of the term and satisfactory performance, the empanelment may be extended from year to year. IIT Guwahati reserves the right to terminate the empanelment at any time without assigning any reason thereof.

Payment of Fee and Other Conditions:

- a) The fees payable to the empaneled Advocates are as per approved fee structure of IIT Guwahati which is given as Annexure II.
- b) No retaining fee shall be paid to any Advocate merely because such Advocate has been empanelled.

Procedure for Empanelment:

The empanelment of the Advocateswill only be based on the evaluation of their eligibility criteria as decided by the Competent Authority of IIT Guwahati. For this purpose, the applications received shall be scrutinized by IIT Guwahati. The final selection will be made based on interview/interaction or any other criteria as fixed/deem fit by the Competent Authority of the Institute. The decision of the Competent Authority of IIT Guwahati in regard to procedures for empanelment will be final and no representation(s) on this matter will be entertained.

Duties/ General instruction to the Empanelled Advocates:

- a) The empaneled Advocates will have to represent IIT Guwahati before different Courts/ Tribunals, etc. in the assigned cases.
- b) The empaneled Advocates shall visit the Institute at least twice a week, preferably spend 4 to 6 hours. In case of any emergency/ urgent work, the Advocatesmay require to visit on Saturdays / Sundays also.
- c) The empaneled Advocates shall not advise any party or accept any case against IIT Guwahati during the period of empanelment.
- d) Timely appearance of the Advocates to contest the cases for IIT Guwahati in the court is a must. Absence in the Court, without any reasonable ground and notice in advance, will not be accepted.
- e) The empaneled Advocates should handle the cases, which are assigned to them, and appear in such assigned cases in the Courts and should prepare Written Statement, Application, Reply Affidavit etc. as and when required and all other maters connected with the assigned case(s).
- f) IIT Guwahati shall send the information through email regarding assignment of a case and after receiving the e-mail, it is the duty of the empaneled Advocates to collect the brief/copy of petition along with assignment letter from the concerned office of IIT Guwahati at the earliest.
- g) The empaneled Advocates should render legal opinion on any legal/administrative matters to IIT Guwahati, and should also be able to prepare Reply to the Legal notices of the applicants on behalf of IIT Guwahati whenever asked for.
- h) IIT Guwahati is free to engage any advocate of its own choice out of the list of empanelment and the empaneled Advocates shall make no claim that it alone should be entrusted with IIT Guwahati's legal matter (s).
- i) Refusal by the empaneled Advocates to accept any work without any reasonable cause (e.g. on grounds of conflict of interest) may entail its removal, forthwith without waiting for the empanelment period to expire.
- j) In order to ensure that there is effective check on the cases being conducted, the empaneled Advocates must report the status of the cases after each date of hearing. Failure to submit status report will be a ground for removal of the empaneled Advocatesor non-payment of the legal fees.

- k) In cases where on the request of the Union of India and Ministry of Education have also to be represented besides IIT Guwahati in some case, no extra fee shall be paid to watch and safe guard the interests of Union of India and Ministry of Education or to contest the case on their behalf.
- I) Keep IIT Guwahati informed and updated on all-important developments in the designated cases, dates of hearing, order of the court on the date of its pronouncement, supplying copy of orders /judgment etc.
- m) Furnish monthly statement about the cases as represented before the concerned courts or any other authority and their outcomes.
- n) When any case attended is decided against the Organisation, the empaneled Advocates concerned must give considered opinion regarding the reasons for such adverse order and the advisability of filling an appeal from such a decision not later than 5 working days of the order.
- o) IIT Guwahati reserves the right to terminate the appointment/empanelment of Advocates with one month's notice in writing without assigning any reason. The empaneled Advocates may also resign from IIT Guwahati by serving one month's notice. In case of termination or completion of the empanelment, the empaneled Advocates are required to hand over all documents pertaining to the cases as held by them to the authorized offices of IIT Guwahati within 7 days from the date of completion/termination of the empanelment.
- p) In the event of any doubt or difference of opinion regarding the terms and conditions of empanelment, the decision of IIT Guwahati shall be final and binding.
- q) The IIT Guwahati may at its discretion can withdraw this notice of empanelment, amend/revise or cancel the same at any stage of empanelment.

 In view of the above, IIT-Karagpur and IIT-Guwahati are requested to furnish the comments/ latest status with regard to matter raised therein to this Ministry at the earliest.

- 2. The subject matter of the draft paragraph is: "In violation of Fundamental Rules, the Indian Institutes of Technology at Kharagpur and Guwahati allowed irregular increment to newly appointed faculty members, selected on the basis of direct recruitment, resulting in overpayment of ₹ 2.78 crore (till March 2022)".
- 3. The draft paragraph is likely to be included in the Audit Report and placed before Parliament. I would, therefore, request that the facts and figures, mentioned in the revised draft paragraph, are confirmed, and the Ministry's response to the matter is sent at the earliest, so that it can be considered while finalizing the draft paragraph.

Irregular allowance of increment to newly recruited faculty members resulted in overpayment of ₹ 2.78 crore

In violation of Fundamental Rules, the Indian Institutes of Technology, at Kharagpur and Guwahati allowed irregular increment to newly appointed faculty members, selected on the basis of direct recruitment, resulting in overpayment of ₹2.78 crere (till March 2022).

In terms of Clause 12(1) of the Statutes of the Indian Institutes of Technology (IIT) at Kharagpur and Guwahati, read with the instruction¹ issued (August/September 2009) by the Ministry of Education (erstwhile Ministry of Human Resource Development), both institutes invited applications for filling up the post of faculty², through open advertisement, with both internal and external candidates being eligible for appointment to the post. Selection was to be made through interviews and on the basis of the recommendations made by the Selection Committee. The Selection Committee was also to provide for protection of pay, if any, to such candidates.

Rule 22(i) (a) (1) of the Fundamental Rules (F.Rs.), dealing with the fixation of initial pay of a government servant, appointed to a post carrying duties and responsibilities of greater importance than those attached to the post previously held by him, states that the initial pay fixation in the higher post is to be made after granting one increment in the time scale of post previously held by him. It further provides that the government servant shall have the

option to get his pay fixed either on the date of appointment to the higher post, or on the date of accrual of the next increment in the time scale of the post previously held by him. The provision to opt for the date of pay fixation is, however, not available to candidates appointed on the basis of direct recruitment.

Test-check of records relating to appointment of newly recruited faculty members, selected on the basis of direct recruitment, showed that both Institutes had allowed them to exercise option regarding date of fixation of their pay at the time of their appointment under F.R. 22(I)(a)(1), which is inadmissible in cases of direct recruitment. Consequently, the newly recruited faculty members opted to have their pay fixed from the date of accrual of the next increment in the time scale of the post previously held by them, either in the same institute, or elsewhere. However, permitting newly recruited faculty members to exercise this option, led to fixation of their pay at a higher stage in the time scale of the new post, from the date of next increment. In 54³ such cases test checked in audit, permitting the exercise of this option, in violation of the Fundamental Rules, resulted in irregular fixation of pay, along with overpayment⁴ amounting to ₹2.78 crore⁵ (till March 2022) (Annexure).

IIT, Kharagpur, replied that the pay fixation of the newly recruited faculty members had been carried out in terms of MHRD's Order⁶ (October 2017), vide which candidates were allowed one notional increment in the existing academic level of pay previously held by them. It further stated that the pay

fixation had been made from the date of next increment, by exercising option under FR 22(I)(a)(1), vide DOPT's OM dated 27.07.2017, which envisages that a government servant shall have the option to have the pay fixed under this rule from the date of such promotion, or to have the pay fixed from the date of accrual of the next increment in the scale of the pay in the lower grade.

IIT, Guwahati, replied that it was aware of the provisions of pay fixation, as observed by Audit, and had followed the same till the implementation of 6th CPC. With the implementation of the recommendation of the 6th CPC, however, there had been anomalies in pay among faculty members, as the date of increment was uniform (1st July every year) for all employees. To remove these pay anomalies, the Board of Governors (BoGs), in its 63rd Meeting, had decided to give an option for fixation of pay from the date of the next increment, to all faculty members appointed to a higher post after 01.01.2006.

The replies of both the Institutes are not tenable, as the provisions under FR 22 (I) (a) (1), read with said DOPT's OM, provide that a Government servant, appointed on the basis of direct recruitment, shall not have the option to have his pay fixed from the date of accrual of next increment in the scale of the pay previously held by him. Thus, the methodology of allowing the option for fixation of pay from the date of the next increment, to the newly appointed faculty members, selected on the basis of direct recruitment, by these Institutes was irregular.

Further, the Ministry of Education, in their reply, have stated (April 2022) that the matter was taken up with both IITs and at IIT Kharagpur, the

As per the decision of the 111th BOG meeting of IIT Guwahati held on 17.06.2022 to examine the matter of Audit Para raised as "Irregular allowance of increment to newly recruited faculty members resulted in overpayment", a Committee was formed and the Committee met on 21.10.2022 at 4.30 PM. The following members were present.

Another member, Prof. R. K. Bhattacharjya, DoRGF could not attend the meeting due to his prior commitments.

The committee has gone through the papers provided by Faculty Affairs in detail. The Committee noted that the Audit Para was first raised in the inspection report for the financial year 2017-18 by the Director General of Audit, Central, Kolkata. The matter was discussed in the meetings of the Finance Committee as well as the Board of Governors of the Institute. In the 96th BoG meeting held on 29.03.2019, the Board constituted a four-member committee to look into the matter and the Committee considered the procedure of pay fixation adopted by the Institute till implementation of the 7th CPC to be valid. Accordingly, a reply was sent to the C&AG and the reply was also placed in the BoG in its 99th meeting held on 31.10.2019.

In parallel, several correspondences between the Institute, C&AG, and Ministry for dropping the para based on the Institute's view that these recruitment of internal faculty members are promotional in nature as there is no promotion policy for faculty positions in the Institute. But C&AG did not drop the para till date with an interpretation that though they are internal candidates, they were selected on the basis of Direct Recruitment.

In the meantime, a letter dated 03.10.2022 from the Ministry of Education was received by the Institute asking about the status of the matter referring to a letter from DGA (Central), Kolkata, where it was mentioned that IIT Kharagpur, has initiated recovery of overpayment with approval of their Board of Governors, whereas in IIT Guwahati, the matter was under deliberation and no recovery of pay and allowance has been made till date.

Considering the above, the Committee felt a re-verification of the pay fixation of the faculty members as pointed out in the Audit para be carried out and recovery, if applicable may be initiated.

The meeting ended with vote of thanks to the chair.

The committee continued the discussion on the regularization of service of Junior attendants appointed against Notification under reference No. I/TG/R/10/2016 which was released for filling up 10 nos. of Junior Attendants (consolidated pay) from amongst the eligible candidates whose family had lost land during setting up of the Institute and the Notification under reference No. IITG/R/112/2016 which was released for filling up 10 nos. of Junior Attendant (consolidated pay) post for the applicants whose names had been forwarded through District Employment Exchange.

The Committee noted that at present there are twenty six (26) Junior Attendants (20+ 6 from waiting list), who were appointed on consolidated pay against above referred Notifications.

The Committee was apprised that at present there are thirteen (13) vacant posts of Junior Atlendants. As per current roster, the category wise break-up of the thirteen (13) vacant posts of Jr. Attendants following the percentage of reservation as applicable to the State of Assam and other DoPT guidelines are UR = 6, SC = 1, OBC= 5, EWS =1. In case, no EWS candidates is available, then the post can be filled up by an UR candidate.

As requested the Convener put up a merit wise list of 13 candidates as per the reservation in the list. On Annexure- I, the merit list drawn by the Selection Committee dated 10.08.2017 is put for reference.







TO CONSIDER THE EXPENSES INCURRED ON ORGANIZING THE NORTH EAST RESEARCH CONCLAVE (NERC) UNDER REVENUE EXPENDITURE OF THE INSTITUTE

IIT Guwahati received an instruction from Ministry of Education to prepare and send a concept note on North East Research Conclave for consideration by the Hon'ble Union Minister (**Annex – V a**). It was done accordingly. Thereafter, IITG was intimated by MoE in December 2021 that, Hon'ble Minister desires North East Research Conclave may be organised during April /May 2022 at IITG involving State Government and leading educational & research institutions of North East region (**Annex – V b**).

As instructed by the Ministry of Education, North East Research Conclave (NERC 2022) was planned to be held at IIT Guwahati during May 20-22, 2022 with an estimated budget of ₹5.87 crores to host tentative 2500 participants. The event was concluded very successfully which was graced by Hon'ble Union Minister of Education, along with Hon'ble Ministers of State for Education and Chief Minister of Assam and other high dignitaries during May 20-22, 2022.

The MoE has been requested vide letter dated 01.03.2022 (**Annex – V c**) to release a financial support of ₹4.00 crore for the NERC. Further, it was also decided to meet the additional expenditure beyond the financial support from the MoE from the Institute funds as the event was to be treated as the Institute Event as per the instructions from the MoE. Therefore, the matter was pursued at the Ministry level to release the financial grant, but in discussion with senior officials of the Ministry, it was advised by them to incur all these expenditures from the Institute grants as the Ministry is releasing the grant to the Institute for taking up such activities. Further, MoE has given additional fund in OH 31 vide letter no. F. No. 27-4/2022-TS-I dated 25th July' 2022.

It was worth mentioning that more than 7500 participations were witnessed excluding the visitors which were in thousands in number. Total number of participating organisations were more than 250 & 100 schools with more than 2200 students (Annexure E). However, conclave was smoothly managed close to the initial proposed budget even after significant increase in the participation due to effective planning. Final audited expenditure is ₹6.24 Crore (Annexure – V d).

It is to be noted that an amount of ₹4.00 crore was provided as seed money from Institute Fund and ₹20.00 lakh from IITG IDF as loan for the event. As per the audited statement submitted by the organizing committee, against the expenditure of ₹6.24 crore, an amount of ₹28.50 lakh was received from external agencies. Thus, funding of an amount of ₹5.96 crore (₹6.24 crore minus ₹28.50 lakh) is required for the conclave.

Being a Ministry mandated event, this ₹5.96 crore be approved to be incurred from the Revenue Expenditure of the Institute which will include the ₹4.20 crore already given as seed money/ IDF loan.




