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Minutes of the 111th meeting of the Board of Governors of Indian Institute of Technology Guwahati held on 17.06.2022

SECTION - A: Confirmation of Minutes, Action Taken Report& Presentation

The One Hundred and Eleventh (111th) Meeting of the Board of Governors of the Institute was held on 17.06.2022 in the Board Room of the Institute. Following members were present in the meeting both offline and online:

Dr. Rajiv I Modi, Chairman BOG could not attend the meeting and as such as per Rule 2(6) of the Statute of IIT Guwahati, the members present elected /selected Dr. Prahlada Rama Rao from amongst themselves to preside at the meeting. Mr. Rakesh Ranjan, Additional Secretary (HE) MoE, Commissioner & Secretary to the Government of Assam and Mr Neel Prakash Chhetri could not attend the meeting due to unavoidable commitments and they were granted leave of absence.

Director welcomed and introduced Mr. P.K Ray, who joined recently as the Registrar of the Institute to the members of the BoG present.

The Presiding member of the BOG meeting, welcomed all the members present in the meeting and requested the Director to give a presentation about various important activities undertaken by the Institute from the last meeting of the BoG till date.

Before taking up the agenda of the day, Director of the Institute gave a brief A/V presentation highlighting some important milestones achieved by the Institute as follows:

Ranking (National and International)- In the recently announced QS World University Ranking 2023, IIT Guwahati has secured 37th rank globally (41st in 2022, 56th in 2021) in the 'Research Citations per Faculty' category and 2nd in India after IISc, Bangalore. The Institute has gained rank 384 in World University Ranking globally. This marks a huge improvement by IIT Guwahati, which was ranked 470 in the 2021 and 395 in 2022 edition of the QS World University rankings.

- > IIT Guwahati signed MoU with Mehta Family Foundation for setting up of Jyoti and Bhupat Mehta School of Health Sciences & Technology.
- MoU signed between Govt. of Assam and IIT Guwahati to set-up Assam Advance Health Innovation Institute (AAHII) at IIT Guwahati, a novel and first such initiative of joint partnership with State Govt. in India.
- > The Hon'ble Chief Minister of Assam Dr. Himanta Biswa Sarma inaugurated a new 'Centre for Disaster Management and Research' (CDMR) at the Indian Institute of Technology Guwahati.
- ➤ IIT Guwahati, launched the Centre for Intelligent Cyber-Physical Systems (CICPS), aimed at developing indigenous technologies. "
- > Shri Dharmendra Pradhan, Hon'ble Minister of Education, Skill Development and Entrepreneurship inaugurated the state-of-the-art Centre for Nanotechnology (CNT) and Centre for Indian Knowledge System (CIKS) as well as two hostels at the Institute.
- > IIT Guwahati started School of Business and the first batch of students at its flagship programme, namely, the Masters of Business Administration (MBA) will start from this academic session.
- Gen (Dr) VK Singh (Retd), Hon'ble Minister of State Civil Aviation, Government of India, inaugurated India's First Drone Airport at IIT Guwahati. Called 'AHOM Drone Ports'.
- > IIT Guwahati launched a new B.Tech program in Data Science and Artificial Intelligence.
- ➤ Visit of High Commissioner of Australia to India Mr. Barry O Farrel to the Institute to discuss about joint collaboration.
- Visit of French delegation led by Dr. Fabien Chareix, Attache for University and Scientific Cooperation, French Institute in India to explore areas of collaborative research.
- > Transfer of Technology-A total of 07 numbers of technology transfer have been registered in the financial year 2021-22.
- Patent Granted- II&SI section of the Institute received total 55 new patent applications and overall, a total of 73 applications were recommended for filing by the Chairman, IPR Committee and around 11 granted till now.
- ➤ Campus Placement- The placement scenario of IIT Guwahati for the year 2021-22 has been impressive so far. A total of 180 companies/organizations from various categories [Private, MNC (Indian origin and foreign origin), Govt., PSU, NGO, etc.] and sectors (Sector wise- IT, R&D, Core Engineering, Consulting, Analytics, Finance, Oil & Gas, Educational, etc.) participated in the virtual recruitment process. The total no. of registered students for virtual campus placement in the year 2021-22 is 1243 students.
- NORTH EAST RESEARCH CONCLAVE 2022: The mega conclave hosted with more than 7000 participant delegates over the three days during 20th-22nd May, 2022. More than 150 academic institutions/colleges/schools and over 100 start-ups/MSME/industries participated. Significant contribution was obtained as the part of the technical sessions. More than 500 oral presentations with more than 500 poster presentations

were made by delegates from all the academic institutions in NE India. During the conclave delegates showcased their R&D activities through Research & Innovation Exhibition. Over 300 exhibitors participated this grand mega event and display their research in various Pavilions designated to IITs/NITs/CFIs/CFTIs across the NE states. Shri Dharmendra Pradhan, Hon'ble Union Minister of Education and Minister of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship, Gol and Dr. Himanta Biswa Sarma, Hon'ble Chief Minister of Assam have inaugurated the Conclave in the presence of Shri Sarbananda Sonowal, Hon'ble Union Minister of Ports, Shipping and Ayush,Dr. Subhas Sarkar& Dr. Rajkumar Ranjan Singh, both Hon'ble Minister of State for Education, Shri Keshab Mahanta, Hon'ble Minister for Health and Family Welfare, Science and Technology and Information Technology, Government of Assam, Shri Ranoj Pegu, Hon'ble Minister of Education, Govt. of Assam, Smt. Queen Oza, Hon'ble MP, Guwahati and other dignitaries.

The Director further informed the Board about visit of the Department Related Parliamentary Standing Committee on Education Women, Children, Youth and Sports under the chairmanship of Dr. Vinay P. Sahasrabuddhe with other 13 MPs visited the Institute and appreciated the success of the Institute on various academic & Research fronts both Nationally and Internationally.

*It may be mentioned that, as the strength of students keep changing throughout the

year, sanctioned faculty strength also changes while calculating in different time of a year. Because of variable nature of data, vacancy positions will also change, making it difficult to keep track of the category-wise vacancy positions. As such, earmarking/calculation of the vacancy positions will be done on the basis of the students' strength (as on 1st April) in the beginning of a particular financial year and use it till the end of that financial year.

Item No .6

To consider adoption of the Annual Accounts of IIT Guwahati for the Financial Year 2021-22

The Board was apprised that the consolidated Annual Accounts of the Institute for the Financial Year 2021-22 comprising the Receipts and Payments Account, Income and Expenditure Account and Balance Sheet are to be submitted to the Director General of Audit, Central, Kolkata, Branch office Beltola Guwahati for audit. But before that it is essential that the Board adopt the same.

A copy of the Annual Accounts was also placed before the Board on the table during the meeting.

It was also apprised to the Board that to consider Adoption of the Annual Accounts of IIT Guwahati for the Financial Year 2021-22 was also placed in the 50th Meeting of the Finance Committee held preceding this Board meeting.

The Board was requested to consider and approve for adoption of the Annual Accounts as per recommendation of the Finance Committee.

The Board resolved as below:

Resolution No: R 111BOG/6 /2022

RESOLVED that the consolidated Annual Accounts of the Institute for the Financial Year 2021-22 comprising the Receipts and Payments Account, Income and Expenditure Account and Balance Sheet be **APPROVED** for **ADOPTION** and same be submitted to the Director General of Audit, Central, Kolkata, Branch office, Beltola for audit as per recommendation of the 50th meeting of Finance Committee .

Item No 7

Audit para "Irregular allowance of increment to newly recruited faculty members resulted in over payment."

The Board was apprised that while implementation of the 6th CPC's recommendations, some Professors of the Institute had submitted representations regarding pay anomaly and stated that some faculty members who joined as Professors later than them were receiving higher band pay. Matter was placed in the 24th meeting of the Finance Committee (FC) held on 08.03.2010 and subsequently in the 63rd Meeting of Board of Governors (BoG) held on 30.11.2010 (Annexure-12 pg.133). The FC had recommended, and the Board had approved, the stepping up of the pay of the affected Professors, subject to concurrence from the MHRD. The Board further noted that the Institute has in the meantime re-examined the issue and found that by applying clause FR 22(I)(a)(1) in the Govt. FRSR Rules, the matter can be resolved. Under this clause, a person placed in a higher scale can opt to delay placement in the higher scale till the date of his/her next annual increment. The Board noted the special circumstances due to the revisions in pay and resolved that all employees appointed to a higher post after 01.01.2006 be given one more chance to opt to delay placement in the higher scale till the date of their next increment. Accordingly, all the affected Professors were given the chance to opt for this to remove the anomalies.

In the meantime, the MHRD vide its letter dated 11.09.2018 suggested to place the status of pending audit paras in the FC/BoG Meetings. The Inspection Report forwarded by the Director General of Audit, Central, Kolkata for the FY 2017-18 along with the comments/replies of the Institute were placed before the FC in its 39th meeting held on 29.03.2019. Summary of the Audit Para on excess payment of pay and allowances raised is enclosed as <u>Annexure-13</u> (pg.134). The FC advised that Audit Para on excess payment of pay and allowances of Rs. 47.51 Lakh due to irregular fixation of some of the faculty members, the pay and allowances of the concerned faculty members be fixed correctly and make it effective immediately. Further, the Committee also advised that the excess payment due to wrong fixation be recovered from the concerned faculty members.

In the meantime, the matter was placed in the BoG in its 96th meeting held on 29.03.2019 (Annexure-14 (pg 135 to 136), the Board noted that the observation/objection of C&AG on the matter of fixation of salary of Faculty members did not consider the aspect of anomaly for which the fixation rule was followed by the Institute. The Board constituted a four-member committee to look in to the matter and the Committee considered the procedure of pay fixation adopted by the Institute till implementation of the 7th CPC to be valid. The committee drafted a reply to the Audit Para on Fixation of Pay and sent it to the C&AG and also placed in the BoG in its 99th meeting held on 31.10.2019 (Annexure-15 pg.137-140).

Till date, C&AG has not dropped the audit para and they are repeatedly communicating to the Institute for necessary action. Latest email communication was from the Ministry of Education (MoE) dated 31.03.2022, forwarding the C&AG's letter dated 22.03.2022, where they referred their earlier letter to the Institute dated 21.05.2021 and requested for necessary action and comments. It may be noted that response to the Ministry's letter dated 21.05.2021, was already sent vide Institute's letter dated 27.05.2021 to the Ministry, again a reply to the MoE sent vide Institute's letter dated 20.04.2022 (Annexure-16 (pg.141 to 165)

referring all the earlier communications made in this regard.

It is to be worth mentioning that, the Institute is responding to all the queries received from the C&AG, since this audit para raised by them. A two-member committee of the Office of Sr. Audit Officer, BO, Guwahati visited IIT Guwahati during 27-28.01.2022 in this connection and they were provided all necessary/relevant documents as requested. Last correspondence with the Office of Sr. Audit Officer, BO, Guwahati was on 21.03.2022 and reply from their end is awaited.

Now, as the concurrence for providing option to the faculty members were taken in the BoG, so the Audit Para raised by the C&AG was placed before the Board for a decision.

The Board after deliberation resolved on the matter as below:

Resolution No: R 111BOG/7 /2022

RESOLVED that the matters needs further examination taking into consideration all other Rules & Regulation as applicable on this matter.

The Board also, **AUTHORIZED** the Director to constitute an internal committee under the Chairmanship of the Deputy Director to examine the matter in details and submit its report to the BoG in their next meeting for their consideration.

Item No.8

To consider the draft policy for considering the credits for Swayam NPTEL-MOOCs.

Ratification of MOU for Assam Advanced Healthcare Innovation Institute (hereinafter referred to as "AAHII") between IITG and Government of Assam

The Board was apprised that an MoU has been signed between the GoA and IIT Guwahati to establish an Assam Advanced Healthcare Innovation Institute (hereinafter referred to as "AAHII") to inculcate cutting-edge research in the diverse areas of Health Sciences and Technology which shall include but not be limited to the areas of cardiac-renal-neuronal-paediatric sciences, transplantation, epidemiology, antibiotic resistance, infection control. The objectives of the proposed Programme are to, -

- (i) Establish AAHII to inculcate cutting-edge research in the diverse areas of Health Sciences and Technology.
- (ii) Establish research laboratories and facilities in AAHII.
- (iii) Create a single umbrella under AAHII to bring in the leading physicians, scientists, engineers, design personnel, social workers, philanthropies, and regulators of national and international repute.
- (iv) Establish a Connected Multi Speciality Hospital (CMSH) under AAHII, which shall have the focus to serve the population of the State. The CMSH to host PG medical programmes such as MD, MS, DNB, MCh, and PhD, to train highly skilled physicians as a process of capacity building activity of the State. The CMSH will also offer academic Masters and PhD programs in engineering, health sciences and other integrated curricula. In addition, the CMSH to offer special integrated Masters and PhD curricula for the medical professionals to foster research under special provisions from National Medical Commission (NMC) or independently by IITG.
- (v) Establish 'Expert Systems' through AAHII in the CMSH with a sizeable emphasis on various fields which shall include but not limited to Data Science and Analytics, Artificial Intelligence, Tele Health, Remote monitoring, Wearable Electronics, Robotic Surgery, and Simulation Labs.
- (vi) Inculcate collaborative research projects with leading Indian and foreign universities and connect the knowledge base to AAHII and CMSH.
- (vii) Establish an ecosystem to identify the field-level 'Unmet needs', novel methods of quick 'Technology Validation' and accelerated 'Technology adoption' through the Nationally and Internationally connected CMSH.
- (viii) Deliver high quality evidence-based care and leverage modern technology and methods for expanding access to care.
- (ix) Develop academic and research capabilities in Assam.

The Committee further recommended a uniform distribution of posts between direct recruitment and internal promotion for all entry level Group-A posts across all the cadres, viz. Assistant Executive Engineer, Technical Officer Gr.II, APEO & Assistant Librarian.

The Committee recommended to earmark 50% posts for Internal Promotion in case of Library Cadre. However the minimum education qualification will be at par with the direct recruitment rules for the said post (Assistant Librarian)

O5 After going through RRs of other older IITs, it was found that many of them gave a Group-A post for the Official Language cadre. However, IIT Guwahati has no such provision in its RR.

The Committee recommends that Sr. Hindi Officer (Pay Level – 8 with minimum 5 years' experience) also be made eligible to apply for the post of Assistant Registrar (internal recruitment) post.

The eligibility criteria of work experience in respect of all such posts may be modified as follows:

- (i) 5 years' of experience in immediate lower post or, OR 10 years' of experience in immediate lower post and previous lower post taken together
- 10 years' minimum experience in immediate lower post and previous lower post taken together
- (ii) For promotion to Pay Level 9, a residency period of at least 3 years in pay level 8 is required.

• 16 years' minimum experience in immediate lower post and previous two lower posts taken together

The Committee also recommended that the existing eligibility criteria of 16 years' experience (taken together) may be withdrawn from such promotional posts.

The Committee observed that the criteria of 16 years' minimum experience in immediate lower post and previous two lower posts taken together in all promotional posts complicates the recruitment process.

- b. The Committee further proposed to abolish the following posts which are not being filled-up so far:
 - 1. Performing Arts Counsellor
 - 2. Artist
 - 3. Junior Artist
 - 4. Draughtsman
 - 5. Electric Supervisor
 - 6. Sewage Supervisor
 - 7. Plumbing Supervisor
 - 8. Midwife/ Nurse
- c. The committee observed that 85 Junior Assistants and 23 Junior Technicians are stagnating in the same position for a long time without an opportunity for upward movement due to lack of availability of posts at the next higher level. The process of promotion for these employees could not be initiated as there is no sanctioned post in the next level. As a remedy, the Committee proposed to convert 20 posts of Junior Assistants to Senior Assistants and 04 posts of Junior Technicians to Senior Technicians. This would provide an opportunity for a large number of eligible employees for up gradation through internal recruitment process.
- d. The Committee also worked out the financial implications arising out of the above conversions of posts and found out to be very nominal (about Rs.22 lacs per annum). Total financial implication is 0.12% of the current Annual Salary Budget of the Institute (about Rs.180 crores per annum)

The proposal is incorporated in **Annexure – 37**(pg.240 to 244),

III. Proposal for a pyramidal structure of posts across non-teaching cadres

- The Committee opined that the posts available of under each cadre should follow a pyramidal structure. The present distribution of the 664 posts based on the student strength of about 6000 in the Institute does not reflect such a structure. Since most of the existing posts are already filled up, it is difficult to a create a pyramidal structure with the existing posts.
- 2. The Committee also noted that the student strength will reach more than 8000 by July 2022, thereby creating a total of 880 non-teaching posts. Though there is an embargo by the Govt. of India on creation of new posts as of now, it is expected that same would be lifted soon. Anticipating this, the committee has proposed a cadre based pyramidal structure as given in the table as Annexure 38.

IV. Other recommendations

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The Committee recommended a periodic review of the RR, say, every five years. The Committee has also prepared a detailed RR after incorporating every change resulted in the process & suggestions received from appropriate authorities as given at Annexure-39 (not enclosed as already uploaded) for non-teaching positions of IIT Guwahati which is recommended to be incorporated in the RR of the Institute.

The signed copy of the Minutes of the meeting of the aforementioned Committee was placed in the table as Annexure-40

Item No. 27

Pay anomaly in respect of some Professors

The Board noted that a number of cases of anomaly of pay of Professors were examined by the Finance Committee in its 24th meeting held on March 8 2010. The Finance Committee had recommended, and the Board had approved, the stepping up of the pay of the affected Professors, subject to concurrence from MHRD. The Board further noted that the Institute has in the mean time reexamined the issue and found that by applying clause FR 22(I)(a)(1) in the Govt. FRSR Rules, the matter can be resolved. Under this clause, a person placed in a higher scale can opt to delay placement in the higher scale till the date of his / her next annual increment. If all the affected Professors opt for this, then the anomalies will be removed and none of the Professors will incur any financial loss due to the delay in implementation the higher scale of pay. However, procedurally, employees have to give this option within one month of appointment in the new post. The Board noted the special circumstances due to the revisions in pay.

<u>R 63/27/2010:</u> The Board **RESOLVED** that all employees appointed to a higher post after 1.1.2006 be given one more chance to opt to delay placement in the higher scale till the date of their next increment as per Clause FR 22(I)(a)(1) of the FRSR Rules of the Govt. of India.

As there were no other matters, the meeting ended with a note of thanks to the Chair.

Audit Para:

As per the Recruitment Rules notified by MHRD for all Centrally Funded Technical Institutions (CFTI) including IITs, recruitment to the post of Assistant Professor, Associate Professor and Professor is done on direct recruitment basis only. Whenever any academic post is advertised, both internal candidates and external candidates can apply for the post. Selection is made on the basis of an interview common to both types of candidates and the selected candidates joins the post on direct recruitment basis.

Rule22(I)(a)(I) of Fundamental Rules (FR) dealing with fixation of initial pay of a government servant appointed to a post carrying duties and responsibilities of greater importance than those attached to the post previously held by him, states that the initial pay fixation to the higher post is to be done after granting one increment on the time scale of post previously held by him. It further provides that the government servant shall have the option to get his pay fixed either on the date of appointment to the higher post or on the date of accrual of next increment in the time scale of post previously held by him. It further states that such an option to opt the date of pay fixation shall not be available to the candidates selected on direct recruitment basis.

However, IITG allowed all faculties selected for appointment on direct recruitment basis to exercise an option regarding the date of fixation of initial pay under F.R.22(I)(a)(I). Test check of service books and recruitment records for faculties appointed between March 2010 and March 2018 revealed that 20 faculties availed the option to get their initial pay fixed from the date of accrual of next increment in the post previously held by them. It was also noted that due to availing the option, their initial pay was fixed at a higher level than the pay that would have been admissible to them had their pay have been fixed on the date of appointment.

IITG in violation of the F.R.22(I)(a)(I) allowed directly recruited faculty to exercise an option for the date of fixation of initial pay on appointment to a higher post, which resulted into irregular fixation of pay at higher level than the pay admissible and consequently resulted into excess payment of pay and allowances (only basic pay, DA & SDA) to these faculties during the period between March 2010 and October 2018.

As such, the clarification/replies sent by the Institute on the matter is not tenable as per C&AG.

Consequently the aforementioned Committee met on 19.09.2019, and deliberated on the matter and considered the procedure of pay fixation adopted by the Institute till implementation of the 7th CPC to be valid. The Minute(Reply to the Audit Para on Fixation of Pay) of the meeting constituted to relook on the Audit observation on excess payment of pay and allowance to some faculty members is given at **Annexure-6** (pg.84-87).

Reply to the Audit Para on Fixation of Pay

It may be appraised to Audit that the Institute is aware of the provisions of Pay fixations as referred by the Audit and implemented the same procedure till implementation of the 6th CPC when the date of increment was made uniform on 1st July every year for all the employees.

The Institute initially fixed the pay to the Faculty Members working in the Institute and appointed in a higher position as per FR 22(1)(a)(1) without giving the option of pay fixation from the next date of increment. While doing so, representations were received from faculty members appointed in a higher position during the period 2nd January to 30th June of a year that because the options were not given to them, their pay had become less than those who were appointed in the same higher position between the period 1th July till 31th December of the same year having the same pay prior to the new appointment.

On examining the matter, it was found that the group of faculty members getting appointment to substantive higher posts during the period of July 01 to December 31 in a given calendar year is automatically given two increments - one regular increment in the previous post on July 01 (uniform date of increment) and other upon appointment to substantive higher post. However, the faculty members who are getting appointment to higher posts during the period of January 01 to June 30 in the same calendar year are getting only one increment. This led to a serious discrepancy in the revised basic pay of two groups of appointees. The faculty who are appointed in the first half of a calendar year would be drawing lower pay even if they were senior than those getting appointed in the second half of the year.

The following table will give a clear picture of the situation

IITG/99th - BOG/MINUTES 31.10.2019

- The faculty Member F1 of Department D1 and the faculty Member F2 of Department D2, both Associate Professors had equal pay at Rs.57160/- as on 01.05.2010.
- Faculty Member F1 was appointed as Professor on 07.05.2010 and pay was fixed at Rs.59880/giving one notional increment as per FR 22(1)(a)(1).
- On 1st July 2010, Faculty member F2 got his annual increment and his pay was fixed at Rs.58880/- whereas the Faculty Member F1's pay would remain the same at Rs.59880/-.
- Faculty Member F2 was appointed as Professor on 01.08.2010 and pay was fixed at Rs.61650/giving one notional increment as per FR 22(1)(a)(1).
- F2 who got appointed later than F1 would get more pay than F1 on the date of appointment which would continue eventually.

In other words, had the option not been given to the Faculty member (F1) getting appointment to a higher substantive post on 7th May 2010, his pay would have become less than the faculty member F2 (having equal pay before such appointment) getting appointment to a higher substantive post on 1st August 2010.

This case as above led to Pay Anomaly as the pay of an employee drawing equal pay with another one on a particular date and got appointed in a higher post earlier would result in lesser pay than the one appointed in the same higher post on a later date.

In view of above anomaly, it was decided to place the matter in the Board of Governors (BoG) for a decision. The matter was deliberated in the 63st meeting of BoG and decided to give the option of fixation of pay from the date of next increment to all employees appointed to a higher post after 01.01.2006 (copy enclosed).

Accordingly, the Institute has started giving the option of fixation of pay from the date of next increment to all employees appointed to a higher post after 01.01.2006 so that there would not be Pay anomaly to the employees.

in view of above, the para may kindly be dropped.

Para 22 - Excess payment of pay and allowances of ₹70.55 lakh due to irregular pay fixation of faculties.

As per the Recruitment Rules notified by MHRD for all Centrally Funded Technical Institutions (CFTI) including IITs, recruitment to the post of Assistant Professor, Associate Professor and Professor is done on direct recruitment basis only. Whenever any academic post is advertised, both internal candidates and external candidates can apply for the post. Selection is made on the basis of an interview common to both types of candidates and the selected candidates join the post on direct recruitment basis.

Rule 22(I)(a)(1) of Fundamental Rules (F.R.) dealing with fixation of initial pay of a Government servant appointed to a post carrying duties and responsibilities of greater importance than those attached to the post previously held by him, states that the initial pay fixation to the higher post is to be done after granting one increment on the time scale of post previously held by him. It further provides that the Government servant shall have the option to get his pay fixed either on the date of appointment to the higher post or on the date of accrual of next increment in the time scale of post previously held by him. It further states that such an option to opt for the date of pay fixation shall not be available to the candidates selected on direct recruitment basis.

However, IITG allowed all faculties selected for appointment on direct recruitment basis to exercise an option regarding the date of fixation of initial pay under F.R. 22(I)(a)(I). Test check of Service Books and recruitment records for faculties appointed between March 2010 and March 2019 revealed that 25 faculties availed the option to get their initial pay fixed from the date of accrual of next increment in the posts previously held by them. It was also noted that due to availing of such option, their initial pay was fixed at a higher level than the pay that would have been admissible to them had their pay been fixed on the date of appointment.

IITG in violation of the F.R. 22(I)(a)(I) allowed directly recruited faculty to exercise an option for the date of fixation of initial pay on appointment to a higher post, which resulted in irregular fixation of pay at higher level than the pay admissibleand consequently resulted in excess payment of pay and allowances (only basic pay, DA and SDA) of ₹70.55 lakh (Annexure-I) to these faculties during the period between March 2010 and March 2019.

This is illustrative only. Similar cases may be reviewed and result thereof may be intimated to audit. The same issue was raised in the previous audit also. In reply (dated 20.09.2019) the Institute contended that to sort out the anomaly of pay the BoG

resolved (in 63rd meeting dated 30.11.10) to apply the provision of FR 22(I)(a)(1). However, no concurrence of the Ministry on the issue was found on records. The reply is awaited.







CREDIT TRANSFER POLICY FOR SWAYAM NPTEL-MOOCS

As per the recommendations of the National Education Policy 2020, it is proposed to give credits to the Swayam NPTEL-MOOC that students enroll. Following is the proposal:

- Every academic department/centre/school should create a basket of NPTEL-MOOCs such that every student gets an opportunity to register at least one elective from NPTEL-MOOCs in lieu of departmental/open electives. If required, such baskets may be created specialization wise.
 - a. All Courses available on NPTEL-MOOC can be viewed at: https://nptel.ac.in/noc/noc_course.html and https://nptel.ac.in/course.html
 - b. Information on NPTEL Semesters from 2018 until 2024 (including exam schedule) is available at: https://nptel.ac.in/noc/NPTELSemester.html
- It is mandatory for all the departments/centres/schools to create such basket of courses for giving sufficient opportunity to the students to register these online courses. However, it is not mandatory for the students to register for such online courses.
- 3. All registered students of IIT Guwahati can take maximum 6 (six) credits for NPTEL-MOOC during their entire degree program. Students can register for a combination of 2 credit and 4 credit courses or a single 6 credit course. However, the Doctoral Degree students can register upto 12 credits.
- 4. Students can take any NPTEL-MOOCs approved by their respective department/centre/school in lieu of any of their Departmental Electives OR Open Electives. Students can even register for additional courses from the basket of the courses approved in their respective department/centre/school as permitted by the ordinances. Total number of credits from NPTEL-MOOC, however, cannot be more than 6 (or 12 for doctoral students).
- 5. Compulsory Courses cannot be replaced with NPTEL-MOOCs.
- 6. Students cannot replace any electives in final semester of their program.
- 7. NPTEL-MOOC Credit Policy is proposed to be as follows:
 - a. 30 hrs of NPTEL-MOOC (12 weeks Course): 6 IITG credits
 - b. 20 hrs of NPTEL-MOOC (8 weeks Course): 4 IITG credits
 - c. 10 hrs of NPTEL-MOOC (4 weeks Course): 2 IITG credits
- 8. Students must note that there is no supplementary examination for NPTEL-MOOCs for candidates who fail the courses. Either they have to repeat the course in the next run (there is no guarantee that all the NPTEL-MOOCs will be offered again in the following semester), or have to take an alternate elective in IITG in the following semester.
- 9. Typically, the pass criteria for NPTEL-MOOCs is as follows:
 - a. Learner is said to be certified in the course and he/she will be eligible for the e-certificate IF Average assignment score \geq = 40/100 AND Proctored certification exam score \geq = 40/100
 - b. Final score = 25% of Average assignment score (out of 100) + 75% of Final proctored certification exam.
- 10. All the existing grading criteria of NPTEL will be followed and credits will be awarded based on the total marks scored in the Assignments and Final Exams. In addition, following criteria will be followed while deciding the grades:

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MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

THIS MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING ("MoU") is made at Kamrup on this 20th day of May, 2022 by and

-BETWEEN-

The Government of Assam through, the Commissioner and Secretary, Medical Education and Research Department having his office at Dispur, Guwahati (hereinafter referred to as "GoA"), of the ONE PART.

-AND-

Indian Institute of Technology, Guwahati, situated at North Guwahati, Kamrup, Assam, India - 781039 (hereinafter referred to as "IITG"), through its authorized signatory Prof.T.G.Sitharam, Director, IIT, Guwahatiof the OTHER PART.

Each of the parties mentioned above are hereinafter collectively referred to as the "Parties" and individually as a "Party".

WHEREAS, Government of Assam is responsible for the Health sector in the State of Assam (hereinafter referred to as "State"). Government of Assam has a renewed focus on the healthcare researchand intends to take concrete steps to improve infrastructure and access to healthcare services, education, and innovation across the state.

AND WHEREAS, IITG established in 1994 has completed 25 years of existence in 2019. At present, the Institute has eleven departments, seven inter-disciplinary academic centres and five schools covering all the major Engineering, Science and Humanities disciplines, offering Bachelor of Technology (B.Tech), Bachelor of Design (B.Des), Master of Arts (MA), Master of Design (M.Des), Master of Technology (M.Tech), Master of Science (M.Sc) and Doctor of Philosophy (Ph.D) programmes.

AND WHEREAS, IITG is one of the major pillars of research and education of the country as well as one of the tallest institutes of National importance in terms of research and development in the Eastern and North-Eastern part of the country.

AND WHEREAS, recently, IITG has established Jyoti and Bhupat Mehta School of Health Sciences and Technology (JBMSHST) aimed at providing fundamental and translational research in the areas related to health sciences. JBMHSTshall offer various undergraduate and postgraduate programs such as Bachelor of Technology (B.Tech), Master of Technology (M.Tech), Doctor of Philosophy (Ph.D), Diplomate of National Board (DNB), Doctor of Medicine (MD), Master of Surgery (MS), Master of Chirurgiae (MCh), MD-PhD, and PhD-MD with the aim of developing a critical mass of highly skilled health and health technology workforce in the region.

AND WHEREAS, Government of Assam has undertaken a number of initiatives to transform the Healthcare scenario of the State including the setting up multiple Medical Colleges, Nursing Institutions, procuring advanced Medical Devices, rolling out Atal Amrit Abhiyan, all aimed at providing better Tertiary Care for the residents of the State/Region, while reducing the Out-of-Pocket Expenses. Recently, the Hon'ble Prime Minister of India inaugurated 7 State-of-the-Art Cancer Hospitals built in partnership with Tata Trusts in Assam, under the joint venture Assam Cancer Care Foundation.

AND WHEREAS, as part of the initiatives taken by the Government of Assam, a unique model of a Research and Innovation Centre in the Health Sciences and Technology has been envisaged with IITG as a joint venture in developing and implementing the roadmap for the same (hereinafter referred to as "Programme"). The present Memorandum of Understanding focuses on a few limited mandates, which shall be expanded in future if both the parties feel appropriate.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Parties hereby record the terms on which they are desirous to provide the facilities in relation to the Programme as follows:-

1. Proposed Collaboration

(1) Background

- (i) Medical Education and Research Department, GoA in collaboration with IITG wishes to establish an Assam Advanced Healthcare Innovation Institute (hereinafter referred to as "AAHII") (or any other name as feasible) to inculcate cutting-edge research in the diverse areas of Health Sciences and Technology which shall include but not be limited to the areas of cardiac-renal-neuronal-paediatric sciences, transplantation, epidemiology, antibiotic resistance, infection control.
- (ii) The major focus of research shall be in the areas of therapeutics, diagnostics, prosthesis, implantation, robotic surgery, simulation labs, bioinformatics, molecular biology, regenerative medicine, stem cells, public health, and data analytics, among others.
- (iii) AAHII is envisioned to be a single umbrella under which physicians, scientists, engineers, design personnel, and regulators shall work together to invent and innovate technologies, which cater to the divergent needs of the population to import substitution at a national level.
- (iv) The activities of AAHIIshall happen around a Connected Multi-Specialty Hospital (hereinafter referred as "CMSH"), which shall also have focus to serve the population of the State and the region. In this regard, AAHIIshall host Post-Graduate (hereinafter referred as "PG") medical programmes such as Doctor of Medicine (MD), Master of Surgery (MS), Diplomate of National Board (DNB), Master of Chirurgiae (MCh), and Doctor of Philosophy (PhD), to train highly skilled physicians as a process of capacity building activity of the State.
- (v) The CMSHshall be established to reduce the physical, mental and economic consequences for citizens by ensuring rationalisation of care across primary, secondary and tertiary levels of

healthcare. The facility is envisioned to be connected to the State Hospitals and Health and Wellness Centres round the clock to ensure the availability of appropriate healthcare across the levels.

- (vi) The CMSH is also envisioned to be connected with National and International Centre for Excellences in medical services to bring in the global expertise on different aspects of clinical care. Rationalization of this model through high band width network connectivity to establish early diagnosis and care to the last mile population, which may not only reduce the health calamities during critical conditions but also decrease the patient burdens in the tertiary care facilities of the State.
- (vii) Government of Assam in the Cabinet held on 16th March 2022 gave an in-principle approval to setup a Medical College with a Super-Specialty Hospital in partnership with IIT Guwahati and subsequently in the Cabinet held on 7th May, 2022 gave Administrative Approval for setting up the same.
- (viii) The erstwhile Health and Family Welfare Department, Government of Assam on 29 January 2022 had set-up an 'Interim Implementation Committee' headed by Commissioner and Secretary, Health and Family Welfare Department (now known as the Medical Education and Research Department) for the implementation of the partnership including setting up of the section 8 entity of the Companies Act, 2013 to manage the project, hire manpower, engage DPR Consultant, Design Architect, and Project Management Consultant etc.

(2) Objectives of the Programme

The objectives of the proposed Programme are to,-

- (x) Establish AAHII to inculcate cutting-edge research in the diverse areas of Health Sciences and Technology.
- (xi) Establish research laboratories and facilities in AAHII.
- (xii) Create a single umbrella under AAHII to bring in the leading physicians, scientists, engineers, design personnel, social workers, philanthropies, and regulators of national and international repute.
- (xiii) Establish a CMSH under AAHII, which shall have the focus to serve the population of the State. The CMSH to host PG medical programmes such as MD, MS, DNB, MCh, and PhD, to train highly skilled physicians as a process of capacity building activity of the State. The CMSH will also offer academic Masters and PhD programs in engineering, health sciences and other integrated curricula. In addition, the CMSH to offer special integrated Masters and PhD curricula for the medical professionals to foster research under special provisions from National Medical Commission (NMC) or independently by IITG.
- (xiv) Establish 'Expert Systems' through AAHII in the CMSHwith a sizeable emphasis on various fields which shall include but not limited to Data Science and Analytics, Artificial Intelligence, Tele Health, Remote monitoring, Wearable Electronics, Robotic Surgery, and Simulation Labs.

- (xv) Inculcate collaborative research projects with leading Indian and foreign universities and connect the knowledge base to AAHII and CMSH.
- (xvi) Establish an ecosystem to identify the field-level 'Unmet needs', novel methods of quick 'Technology Validation' and accelerated 'Technology adoption' through the Nationally and Internationally connected CMSH.
- (xvii) Deliver high quality evidence-based care and leverage modern technology and methods for expanding access to care.
- (xviii) Develop academic and research capabilities in Assam.

(3) Scope of the programme

The Scope shall be inter-alia,-

- (i) to optimally plan, design and implement a facility for AAHII and CMSH at IITGhereinafter known as "Project". Proposed locations are provided in ANNEXURE-1;
- (ii) to create a new non-profit organization as a Special Purpose Vehicle (SPV) to execute this project and manage its operations withrepresentation from GOA and IITG on its Board of Directors (BoD). Governance structure is provided in ANNEXURE-2;
- (iii) to design other research and health programmes that will lead to better health and socioeconomic outcomes for the public;
- (iv) to focus on research and related infrastructure, aimed at advancing ourunderstanding of the therapeutics, diagnostics, prosthesis, implantation, robotic surgery, simulation labs, bioinformatics, molecular biology, regenerative medicine, stem cells, public health, and data analytics, specific to the State;
- (v) to connect, know, collaborate, and adapt the world classevidence-based innovations in health for the State.

2. Mechanism

The following broad framework will be followed in the Project:-

- (1) Obligations and Responsibilities of Government of Assam,-
 - (i) Government of Assam Services: Observe oversight role through the Board of Directors of the SPV to be formed for this purpose on program planning, progress monitoring, extending administrative and other forms of support as may be necessary from time to time, legal and statutory clearances, empanelment with various health schemes of the State and the Centre.

- (ii) Education: Facilitate and support inclusion of PG courses recognized by National Medical Council/Indian Institute of Technology/Diplomate of National Board/Atomic Energy Regulatory Board; accreditation of bespoke training programs developed by IITG; and any other support as requested by the Board of Directors (BoD) from time to time.
- (iii) Research: Facilitate and support the advancement of research through encouraging participation of state health facilities from time to time, on an as needed basis.
- (iv) Implementation: Suitable land parcels shall be made available to SPV as indicated in ANNEXURE-1; facilitate and support the expeditious delivery of the Project as per timelines set by the Board of Directors (BoD); and any other support as requested by the Board of Directors (BoD) from time to time after due necessary approvals.
- (v) Governance: Create a non-profit joint entity called 'Assam Advanced Healthcare Innovation Institute(referred as "AAHII"), a joint venture between Government of Assam and IITG registered as a separate company under section 8 of the Companies Act, 2013. Appoint Directors to Board of Directors (BoD) as per the organogram provided in the ANNEXURE-2; ensure autonomy of AAHII and CMSH, and any other support as requested by the Board of Directors (BoD) from time to after due necessary approvals. Include any Private/Philanthropic Not-for-Profit Equity Partners, as may be felt necessary, in the Company, based on the value addition brought by the partner.
- (vi) Financing: Transfer milestone-based funds during project implementation (including but not limited to for construction, plant and machinery installation and medical equipment purchase etc.) of the facilities as per the DPR to the SPV on request by the Board of Directors (BoD)(ANNEXURE-3); provide operational gap funding as requested by Board of Directors (BoD); and any other support as requested by the Board of Directors (BoD)from time to time after due necessary approvals.

(2) Obligations and Responsibilities of IITG

- (i) Services: Provide land for the hospital to be constructed (as indicated in ANNEXURE-1), ensure complete development of AAHII and CMSH to facilitate appropriate technology Research and Development (R and D) work and develop multi-disciplinary team of researchers for cutting edge translational work in frontier areas of health sciences.
- (ii) Education: Implement bespoke training programs covering the entire gamut of healthcare services such as PG medical courses and other allied courses such as Nursing, Public health, Health datascience etc.
- (iii) Research: Identify appropriate research projects to further knowledge regarding the diseases prevalent in the North-East region.
- (iv) Implementation: Take all measures for expeditious establishment of the hospital in an efficient, costeffective manner that is compliant with highest quality in terms of national and international

accreditation standards, as per the approvals obtained from the Cabinet of Minister, Government of Assam (December 2021 and March 2022). This shall include preparation of DPR, engagement of consultant, architect and contractor, recruit suitable staff members in specialised roles in the SPV and AAHII-CMSH, implementation of Health Management Information System (HMIS), operations planning, process manual design and implementation etc. The areas mentioned above are only indicative; IITG is in the process of building its capability in undertaking granular project implementation through synergising a complex interplay between many other factors. The implementation to include any other support as requested by the Board of Directors (BoD) from time to time after due necessary approvals.

(v) Governance: Create a non-profit joint entity AAHII(or any other name as feasible), a joint venture between Government of Assam and IITG registered as a separate company under section 8 of the Companies Act, 2013.

3. Representatives

- (1) Representatives shall be identified and notified to the Special Purpose Vehicle by the Parties.
- (2) Either Party may change and/or nominate additional representatives as it may deem necessary subject to intimation in writing to the other Party.
- (3) Each of the Parties warrants and undertakes that it (and any person acting on its behalf) shall comply with all applicable laws while performing under this MoU.

4. Representation, Warranties and Undertakings

- (1) IITG have represented that each of its Programme related initiatives are in compliance with applicable laws and Government rules.
- (2) IITG has further represented that this MoU,-
- (i) is within its powers and has been duly authorised by it;
 - (ii) constitutes its legal, valid and binding obligations;
 - (iii)does not conflict in any material respect with any law or regulation or its constitutional documents or any document binding on it and that it has obtained all consents for the performance by it of this MoU.
- (3) The Government of Assam has represented that each of its Programme related initiatives are in compliance with applicable laws and government rules.

- (4) Government of Assam has further represented that this MOU,-
 - (i) is within its powers and has been duly authorised by it;
 - (ii)constitutes its legal, valid and binding obligations;
 - (iii)does not conflict in any material respect with any law or regulation or its constitutional documents or any document binding on it and that it has obtained all necessary consents for the performance by it of this MoU.
- (5) Each of the Parties warrants and undertakes that it (and any person acting on its behalf) shall comply with all applicable laws while performing under this MoU.

5. Governance

- (1) In order to bring in national and international expertise and best practices, it is proposed that a section 8 entity under Companies Act, 2013 not-for-profit company i.e. the SPVthat is established that shall develop and operate the facilities.
- (2) The SPVshall have representation from the Government of Assam and IITG on its Board of Directors (BoD).
- (3) TheBoard of Directors (BoD)shall have ultimate decision-making power in guiding the development of the facilities and shall appoint a Managing Committee to deliver on the objectives laid down.
- (4) The SPVshall substantially follow procurement norms. It shall be open to audit by Auditor General if required.
- (5) The SPV may explore to infuse suitable private/philanthropy capital as equity partner to bring in professional expertise in the operations.
- (6) Government of Assam and IITG will explore the possibility of bringing in Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) grants and/or contributions from the private companies and philanthropic organizations to augment the resources.

6. Operational Model

The program implementation shall have two parts. Initially, the establishment of all greenfield facilities under the Project by May 2026. Simultaneously, a rapid scale-up of operations, as per the timelines indicated in ANNEXURE-3.

7. Notices

Any notice (including written intimation) required to be given under this MoU shall be deemed to have been duly given upon receipt when in writing and delivered in person, by facsimile transmission, by email, or by courier to the representative.

8. Effective Date and Term

This MoU shall become effective from a date to be notified by the Government of Assam and shall remain in effect for a period of five years. At the end of five years, both the Parties may extend the term of this MoU on such terms and conditions as may be mutually agreed in writing.

9. Governing Law and Dispute Resolution

- (1) This MoU shall be interpreted, construed and enforced in accordance with the laws of India.
- (2) In the event of any dispute between the Parties arising under this MoU (including with regard to the existence, validity or enforceability of this MoU or any provisions hereof), IITG and Government of Assam, shall use their best efforts to resolve such dispute amicably through discussions between senior representatives of the Parties.
- (3) Any dispute between the Parties as to matters arising under this MoU, which cannot be settled amicably within 30 days after receipt by one Party of the other Party's written request for amicable settlement, may be submitted by either Party to arbitration in accordance with the provisions as follows: any and all disputes or claims arising under this MoU or out of or in connection with the execution, interpretation, performance, or non-performance of this MoU or any or all of the foregoing shall be solely and finally settled by arbitration. Judgment upon any arbitral award rendered hereunder may be entered in any court having jurisdiction, or application may be made to such court for a judicial acceptance of the award and an order of enforcement, as the case may be. The arbitration proceedings shall be conducted in accordance with the Arbitration and Conciliation Act, 1996 and any amendment or re-enactment thereof and the rules made there under. Each dispute submitted by a Party shall be heard by a third arbitrator who will be appointed by one arbitrator from each Party.

10. Amendments

No amendment, supplement, modification or clarification to this MoU shall be valid or binding unless set forth in writing and duly executed by the Parties to this MoU.

11. Relationship

This MoU is on a principal-to-principal basis between the Parties hereto. Nothing contained herein shall be deemed to create any association, partnership, joint venture or relationship of principal and agent or master and servant or employer and employee between the Parties hereto or any affiliates thereof or to provide either Party with the right, power or authority, whether express or implied to create any such duty or obligation on behalf of the other Party.

12. Survival

The provisions that survive the termination of this MoU by implication, including but not limited to the provisions of clauses 7, 9, 10, 11 shall survive the termination of this MoU.

13. Counterparts

This MoU is executed in 2(two) counterparts, each of which shall be considered original and all of which taken together, constitute one and the same instrument and each Party shall retain one set.

14. Termination

Either Party may initiate termination of this MoU, by giving at least three months prior notice in writing to other Party. The termination notice shall specify the reason for terminating this MoU. In case of termination of this MOU neither Party shall be liable to pay any compensation to other Party.





EXTRACT OF THE MINUTE OF 161st MEETING OF THE SENATE HELD ON 06.05.2022

<u>Item 8:</u> To consider the proposal for a new M.Des programme in Electronics Product Design from the Department of Design.

The Senate found that IIT Guwahati signed an MoU with the Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology, Government of India for developing human capital in the area of electronics product design. One of the initiatives in this direction is to start a M.Des programme in Electronics Product Design. The graduating students are expected to be skilled at design and development of electronic products, services and applications targeting various segments like toy designs and services, healthcare products and ecosystem, mobile devices and services, electronic components and industrial products. In addition to designing electronic products and services, the program also aims to create skilled human resources in Industry 4.0, especially targeting the ability to virtually prototype, train and design electronic products and services.

In this connection, the Department of Design submitted a proposal as placed in **Annexure 161/8** (Page No. 14-38) for a new M.Des Programme in Electronics Product Design.

The Senate noted that the proposal was circulated among the departments, centres and schools for feedback.

the Senate further noted that the matter was considered in the joint meeting of 119th IPPC and 124th IUPC, held on 29.04.2022. The IPPC recommended the proposal to be placed in the Senate.

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Minutes of the 161st Meeting of the Senate held on 6th May, 2022 Indian Institute of Technology Guwahati

After due deliberation the Senate approved the proposal and recommended the same to place in the BoG for approval so as to start the programme from July 2022 session.

The Senate further recommended that the admission statistics be reviewed after two years and reported to the Senate, as the department had made CEED qualification as a mandatory requirement in the eligibility criteria.

R.161/8/2022: The Senate RESOLVED that the proposal for a new M.Des programme in Electronics Product Design from the Department of Design be APPROVED and RECOMMENDED to place the matter to the BoG for approval.

The Indian Institute of Technology Guwahati has taken in initiative to provide iron, arsenic, fluoride and other contaminant free drinking water to the rural peoples with the help of innovative technologies. This effort is made to fulfil the 6th sustainable goal (SDG) set by the Govt. of India. Prof. Mihir Kumar Purkait from the Department of Chemical Engineering, IIT Guwahati has developed various types of prototype units (based on nanotechnology, adsorption and electrocoagulation techniques) for the treatment of Iron, Arsenic and Fluoride contaminated drinking water for household and community purposes. The technology is patented and transferred to industry for commercial production. Prof Purkait has developed many water treatment plans and installed sucessfully in schools, templeas and in the rural villages of Assam where pipewater supply is not available.

Apart from technology demonstration, Prof Purkait is actively involved with various activities of different Departments of Govt of Assam including PHED, SPCB, P&RD, SITA etc.

He will be involved with the evaluation, assessment studies of government programs/ interventions and coordinate with State and District Water & Sanitation Mission during his chair tenure.

The project will carry out translational research work on the removal of contaminants in drinking water and industrial wastewater. Different contaminants persistent in these two sources will be subjected to removal by a novel mechanism, like, membrane separation, nanotechnology, metalorganic framework (MOF) enhanced filtration, functional polymer beads, electrocoagulation, bioremediation, advanced oxidation process, etc. Studies will also be carried out on established processes, like, adsorption, electrocoagulation, and precipitation to increase their efficiency. Also, a hybrid system will be developed for targeted applications. Emphasis will be on the development of novel, efficient, cost-effective, sustainable, and innovative integrated technology followed by deployment of field/ pilot-scale treatment unit on site without compromising the quality.

GRANT AGREEMENT

This Grant Agreement ("Agreement"), is made this ___ day of May, 2022 ("Effective Date") by and between SCHWAB CHARITABLE FUND ("Schwab Charitable"), a California nonprofit corporation with a business address of 211 Main Street, San Francisco, CA 94105 and Indian Institute of Technology Guwahati, ("Foreign Charity"), a _______.

Each of Schwab Charitable and Foreign Charity may be referred individually as a "Party" and collectively as "Parties".

WHEREAS, Schwab Charitable has made a reasonable, good faith determination, based on the written advice of a qualified tax practitioner, that Foreign Charity is the equivalent of a charitable organization exempt from United States federal income taxation under sections 501(c)(3) and 509(a)(1), (2), or (3) of the United States Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code");

WHEREAS, Schwab Charitable is a public charity and sponsoring organization as defined in Sections 501(c)(3), 509(a)(1) and 4966(d)(1) of the Code, which makes distributions to qualified charitable organizations such as Foreign Charity;

WHEREAS, a donor advised fund account has been established (the "Account") and funds have been contributed to the Account by Rahul B. Mehta, Mehta Family Fund ("Donor Advisor");

WHEREAS, Schwab Charitable has exclusive legal control over the funds in the Account and provides the Donor Advisor with advisory privileges with respect to distributions from the Account;

WHEREAS, the Donor Advisor has recommended a distribution from the Account to Foreign Charity for charitable purposes;

WHEREAS, Schwab Charitable desires to make the distribution as recommended by the Donor Advisor subject to the terms and conditions herein; and

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises exchanged herein, and intending to be legally bound, the Parties agree as follows:

 Grant. Schwab Charitable intends to make a grant to Foreign Charity in an amount of up to \$5,000.00 (the "Grant" or "Grant Funds") in one payment, as set forth in the below payment schedule; provided that Foreign Charity complies with and satisfies all terms and conditions of this Agreement.

All payments contemplated in this Agreement are in Schwab Charitable's sole discretion, and, notwithstanding anything in this Agreement to the contrary, no payments may be paid if: Foreign Charity breaches this Agreement; Donor Advisor does not recommend a grant payment; the Donor Advised Fund Account contains less than the amount needed to fully fund a recommended payment; or Schwab Charitable determines in good faith that Foreign Charity is no longer the equivalent of a charitable organization exempt from United States federal income taxation under Code sections 501(c)(3) and

509(a)(1), (2), or (3). Schwab Charitable may modify payment amounts and dates, and will notify Foreign Charity of any such changes in writing.

- 2. Purpose. This Grant is made for wherever it is needed most ("Grant Purpose").
- 3. Use of Grant Funds. The Grant Funds, together with any interest or other income generated by the Grant Funds (collectively "Income"), shall not be expended for any other purpose than that set forth in Section 2, Purpose, without Schwab Charitable's prior written approval, which may be withheld in Schwab Charitable's sole discretion. Foreign Charity may not use Grant Funds to reimburse any expenses incurred prior to the Effective Date. In no event, may Foreign Charity use Grant Funds to:

 (a) influence the outcome of any election for public office or to support lobbying activities; (b) fulfill any existing legal obligation of the Donor Advisor or any other advisor to the Donor Advised Fund Account (e.g. a legally binding pledge); (c) provide, directly or indirectly, more than an incidental benefit to (or for the use of) the Donor Advisor or any other advisor to the Donor Advised Fund Account, any family member thereof, or to any individual who is not a beneficiary of the Foreign Charity's charitable programs (each a "Disqualified Person"); or (d) enable a Disqualified Person to purchase any benefit that is more than incidental if the Disqualified Person would not have been able to purchase the benefit except for this Grant (i.e. bifurcation of funds). Foreign Charity acknowledges that Schwab Charitable has not earmarked Grant Funds to support lobbying activities or to otherwise support attempts to influence legislation.
- 4. Return of Grant Funds. Any Grant Funds or Income that have not been used for, or committed to, the Grant Purpose upon termination of this Agreement must be returned promptly to Schwab Charitable, or applied to another mutually-agreed upon charitable purpose, as directed in writing by Schwab Charitable. Foreign Charity agrees to return all or part of the Grant Funds to Schwab Charitable, upon Schwab Charitable's request, if Foreign Charity has not fully complied with the terms and conditions of this Agreement, as determined in Schwab Charitable's sole discretion; or if required by any law or regulation applicable to Foreign Charity, Schwab Charitable, or this Agreement. This Section 4 shall survive this Agreement.
- Representations and Warranties. Foreign Charity acknowledges that Schwab Charitable is materially relying on this Agreement, and on the information Foreign Charity provides in reports and otherwise to Schwab Charitable. Foreign Charity represents that all such information is true and correct, and that Schwab Charitable may continue to rely on this information and on any additional information Foreign Charity provides to Schwab Charitable.

Foreign Charity further represents and warrants that, at all times during the term of this Agreement: (a) Foreign Charity will comply with all applicable laws, Executive Orders, regulations, and rules and will not infringe, misappropriate, or violate the intellectual property, privacy, or publicity rights of any third party; (b) Foreign Charity will maintain complete control and discretion over the Grant and the use of the Grant Funds; (c) Foreign Charity is a nonprofit organization validly existing and in good standing as of the date of this Agreement; (d) the information Foreign Charity provided to Schwab Charitable, or an agent thereof, in connection with Schwab Charitable's reasonable, good faith determination that Foreign Charity is the equivalent of a charitable organization exempt from United States federal income taxation under Code sections 501(c)(3) and 509(a)(1), (2), or (3) remains accurate in all material respects as of the date of this Agreement; and (e) there is no issue presently pending before any government or regulatory body that could result in any changes to Schwab Charitable's reasonable, good faith determination that Foreign Charity is the equivalent of a charitable organization exempt from United States federal income taxation under Code sections 501(c)(3) and 509(a)(1), (2), or (3) (a "Material Adverse Change"); and (f) Foreign Charity will inform Schwab Charitable immediately of any Material Adverse Change. This Section 5 shall survive this Agreement.

For the avoidance of doubt, before making any disbursement to any subgrantee or other third party of Grant Funds, Foreign Charity shall check such subgrantee or third party against the Specially Designated Nationals ("SDN") List maintained by the Office of Foreign Assets Control of the U.S. Department of the Treasury. If any subgrantee or third party checked by Foreign Charity appears on the SDN List, Foreign Charity will notify Schwab Charitable and shall not make any disbursement to such subgrantee or third party unless and until Schwab Charitable confirms, in its sole discretion, that it has determined that such subgrantee's or third party's appearance on the SDN List was a false-positive appearance.
- Anti-Corruption and Anti-Bribery. Foreign Charity will not offer or provide money, gifts, or any other things of value directly or indirectly to anyone in order to improperly influence any act or decision relating to the Grant Purpose, or Grant Funds, including by assisting any party to secure an improper advantage.
- 9. Publicity. This Grant is from a Donor Advised Fund Account sponsored by Schwab Charitable. This Grant is not directly from the Donor Advisor or any other advisor with privileges on the account. Accordingly, any public statements regarding the Grant should acknowledge the Grant as coming from the Schwab Charitable Fund made possible by the generosity of Rahul B. Mehta, Mehta Family Fund.
- 10. Term and Termination. Unless otherwise terminated earlier in accordance with this Section 10, the term of this Agreement commences on the Effective Date and continues until December 31, 2022, on which date it shall terminate.

Schwab Charitable may immediately terminate this Agreement if: (a) Schwab Charitable is not reasonably satisfied with Foreign Charity's progress on the Grant Purpose; (b) there are significant changes to Foreign Charity's leadership, majority changes to Foreign Charity's board of directors, or other factors that Schwab Charitable reasonably believes may threaten the Grant Purpose's success; or (c) Foreign Charity fails to comply with this Agreement.

11. Governing Law. This Agreement shall be governed by and interpreted in accordance with the laws of the State of California, applicable to contracts to be performed entirely within California, without giving effect to its conflict of laws provisions. This Section 11 shall survive this Agreement.

- 12. Independent Parties. Foreign Charity is solely responsible for all activities supported by the Grant, the content of any product created with the Grant Funds, and the manner in which any such product may be disseminated. This Agreement does not create any agency relationship, partnership, or joint venture between the Parties, and Foreign Charity will make no representation to anyone to the contrary.
- 13. Responsibility for Others. Foreign Charity is responsible for all acts and omissions of any of Foreign Charity's trustees, directors, officers, employees, subgrantees, subcontractors, contingent workers, agents, and affiliates assisting with this Grant and ensuring their compliance with the terms of this Agreement. Foreign Charity has the exclusive right to select subgrantees and subcontractors to assist with the Grant Purpose.
- 14. Legal Entity and Authority. Foreign Charity confirms that: (a) Foreign Charity is an entity duly organized or formed, qualified to do business, and in good standing under the laws of the jurisdiction in which Foreign Charity is organized or formed; (b) Foreign Charity has the right to enter into and fully perform this Agreement; and (d) Foreign Charity's performance will not violate any agreement or obligation between Foreign Charity and any third party. Foreign Charity shall notify Schwab Charitable immediately if any of the statements made in this Section 14 are no longer true during the term of this Agreement.
- 15. Survival. A Party's obligations under this Agreement will be continuous and survive termination of this Agreement as expressly provided in this Agreement or otherwise required by law or intended by their nature.
- 16. Entire Agreement and Modification. This Agreement contains the entire agreement of the Parties and supersedes all prior and contemporaneous agreements concerning its subject matter. Except as specifically permitted in this Agreement, no modification, amendment, or waiver of any provision of this Agreement will be effective unless in writing and signed by authorized representatives of both Parties.
- 17. Assignment. This Agreement shall be binding upon, and shall inure to the benefit of the Parties and their respective successors and assigns. Neither Party may assign, or transfer by operation of law or court order, any of rights or obligations under this Agreement without the prior written consent of the other Party and any attempt to do so is void.
- 18. Severability. Each provision of this Agreement shall be interpreted in a way that is enforceable under applicable law. If any clause or provision of this Agreement is held invalid, illegal or unenforceable under present or future federal, state or local laws, then it is the intention of the Parties that the rest of the Agreement will remain in effect and such invalidity, illegality or unenforceability shall not affect any other clause or provision.
- 19. Captions. All captions and headings in this Agreement are for the purposes of reference and convenience only. They do not limit or expand the provisions of this Agreement.
- 20. Counterparts and Electronic Signatures. Except as may be prohibited by applicable law, this Agreement and any amendment may be signed in counterparts, by facsimile, PDF, or other electronic means, each of which will be deemed an original and all of which when taken together will constitute one agreement. Facsimile and electronic signatures will be binding for all purposes.

Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) between Department of Higher Education, Ministry of Education, Government of India & the Indian Institute of Technology Guwahati for 2022-23 in pursuance of the Rule 229(xi) of the GFR, 2017

This Memorandum of Understanding (hereinafter referred to as MoU) is entered into at New Delhi on this _____ day of ______, 2022 between Department of Higher Education, Ministry of Education, Government of India, Shastri Bhawan, Rajendra Prasad Road, New Delhi-110011 (hereinafter referred to as MoE)

And

The Indian Institute of Technology Guwahati (hereinafter referred to as the Institute) having its Headquarter at Guwahati and represented by its Director (hereinafter referred to as the Institute) which term and expression shall mean and include, unless repugnant to the context, its successors, assignees, administrators of the Institute.

WHEREAS

- 1. This MoU is executed in terms of Rule 229 (xi) of the General Financial Rules, 2017 (hereinafter referred to as GFR, 2017) and the subsequent instructions issued by the Ministry of Finance, Department of Expenditure, (hereinafter referred to as MoF) with the objective of improving efficiency of the expenditure, making the action plan outcome oriented, maintaining financial discipline and measuring performance of the Institution on key parameters against the targets set so as to improve its performance.
- 2. The Institute has the pre-defined Vision, Mission and Objectives as outlined hereunder:-
 - To be recognized internationally for excellence in research, pursuit for developmental activities and deep concern for students' care
 - ii) To be of service to the citizens of the Country
 - iii) To become a preferred destination of :
 - Students seeking best science and engineering education
 - Scholars seeking intellectual ambiance and encouragement for research
 - Companies recruiting innovative minds
 - Organizations seeking collaboration in product development
 - iv) Values:

- Academic excellence and freedom
- Fostering the spirit of inquiry, adventure and exploration both at problem solving and conceptual advancement
- Continuous improvement of programs and processes
- The success of students and develop their individuality
- Personal and professional development of the faculty and staff
- Diversity among the students, faculty and staff
- v) Institutional Goals:
- To be recognized as one of the world's top 100 Institute/
 University in coming fifteen year
- To enhance external grant and research funding at the level of Internationally well ranked institutes
- To graduate 95% of the entering PhD students within four years while maintaining rigorous academic standards
- To furnish state-of -art facilities for all programs in coming fifteen years

(A) Mission:

- i) To act as a nucleus for the growth of science and technology
- ii) To sustain and foster excellent education in engineering and science in undergraduate levels
- iii) To give a major boost to the existing post-graduate coaching/ teaching and research programmes, initiate new research activities in selected disciplines and achieve excellence
- iv) To promote globalization and support for local industries hand in hand
- v) To promote technology, transfer from Institute to Industries and academic institutions
- vi) To promote innovation in all field and provide support to innovators and entrepreneurs
- vii) To promote sponsored research and collaborative projects with industries, R&D Organization and academic institutions in India and Abroad

viii) To contribute to the development of India and North East India in particular.

C) Objectives:

- i) To provide the best educational infrastructure for imparting high class education in science and technology and a creative atmosphere for inter-disciplinary research both by the students and the faculty
- To increase the student capacity to meet the growing demands for the country
- To maintain global standards in in student-faculty ration, research output, publications in journals and placement of students
- iv) To participate in and contribute to nation building
- v) To provide research and development consultancy, which will foster health industry-academia partnership, thereby providing a competitive edge to the indigenous manufacturing.

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties here to express their common understanding as under:

(A) MOE shall

- (i) Provide financial support to the Institute to meet its recurring and non-recurring liabilities in such manner and on such conditions as prescribed by the Government of India (hereinafter referred to as GoI) from time to time,
- (ii) Help raise other resources, including loan from HEFA for expansion of infrastructural facilities, which have a direct bearing on the performance of the Institute as committed in this MOU.
- (iii) Provide guidance and advice in administrative, financial, legal and such other matters as the Institute may require in fulfilling its mandate.
- (iv) Provide support in obtaining necessary clearances and approvals, as and when required, from various Ministries, Departments, and Agencies of the Central/State Governments.
- (v) Provide support in resolving any dispute with any other authority of the Central/State Government or a private party, as and when required.
- (B) THE INSTITUTE shall comply with:

- (i) Without prejudice to what has been stipulated in the Institute of Technology Act, 1961 (hereinafter referred to as the Act of 1961), as amended from time to time and the Statutes framed there under, the institute is expected to recover user charges at rates not lower than cost recovery norms
- (ii) Specific provisions as contained in the OM No.1/1/2016-E.IIIA dated 13.01.2017 in relation to revision of pay scales in accordance with the recommendations of the 7th CPC and any other instruction issued by MOE from time to time on issues pertaining to the Institute.
- (iii) The provisions of the GFR, 2017, including the instructions on financial advice for autonomous bodies, as mentioned in Rule 229(viii) and those concerning release of grants-in-aid, submission of audited accounts, performance report etc.
- (iv) Guidelines issued by the Central Vigilance Commission (CVC) in matters of vigilance and disciplinary proceedings etc.
- (v) Uniform accounting procedure in accordance with the guidelines issued by MoF.

Provisions of the Institutes of Technology Act, 1961, the Statutes framed thereunder and the instructions issued by MOE from time to time with regard, inter-alia, to creation of posts and framing of Recruitment Rules.

(C) THE INSTITUTE shall also ensure to:

- (i) Finalize any understanding or MoU with any other party including similar organizations abroad in accordance with the provisions of the Act of 1961 and the Statutes framed there under, and the instructions issued by MOE from time to time.
- (ii) Frame Rules for its corpus fund indicating clearly the Internal Revenue Generation(IRG) that can be transferred to such fund or utilized from such fund and items for which such expenditure can be incurred.
- (iii) Have clearly defined 'Delegation of Powers' for deciding all administrative and financial matters.
- (iv) Shall run courses, to the extent possible, to be self supporting without the need for cross subsidization as well as over-charging from students for flagship courses.
- (v) Ensure that the post of Registrar is filled up by a person having sufficient experience in administration and should preferably be an appropriate level official from the Government on deputation to ensure neutrality and transparency.
- (vi) Ensure that the Recruitment Rules for the posts of Registrar and the Finance Officer are framed and the selection must follow the Recruitment Rules.

- (vii) Ensure that all its accounts are audited by internal auditors regularly and formal audit by the C&AG in terms of the provisions of the Act of 1961 and the Statutes framed thereunder.
- (viii) Ensure that all financial operations are done under the **EAT Module of PFMS** and transaction done through TSA mode.
- (ix) Present an outcome budget along with annual action plan so that it can be dovetailed in the outcome budget of MOE.
- (x) Comply strictly with the timelines for submission of annual reports and annual audited accounts to MOE for the purpose of being tabled in Parliament within 9 months from close of the financial year.
- (xi) Forward to MOE any information required by it to satisfy any requirement related to Parliamentary Matter, RTI, Public Grievances, VIP References, Court Cases, and Notices from Commissions and Statutory Authorities and also inputs for formulation of any policy.
- (xii) In order to attract good number of meritorious students to join PMRF scheme, faculty members of the institute has identified 30 potential students in final year; for mentoring and guiding them in preparing projects / abstracts so that they are able to meet the PMRF selection criteria.
- (xiii) The Institute to ensure that the reservation in prescribed percentage is followed as per the CEI (Reservation in Admission) Act, 2006 for students and as per the CEIs (Reservation in Teachers Cadre) Act for faculties. Also, the GoI guidelines are followed in recruitment of non-teaching posts. The Institute shall ensure equal opportunities and necessary facilities to persons with disabilities in admission and services as per the law.
- (xiv) Special recruitment drive in mission mode will be conducted by the Institute to fill the vacant faculty positions. So far the recruitments are in process.

Weightage for the Length of Service at the Institute in case of promotional posts

The eligibility criteria of work experience in respect of all such promotional posts may be as follows:

• Five years of experience in the present post of the employee.

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• Ten years of experience in the present post and the immediate lower post taken together. For promotion to a post of Pay Level 9, three years of experience in a post of Pay Level 8 is required.

Weightage for all Promotional Posts:

- APAR marks for last five years at actuals = 50%
- Performance in written test/ interview = 45%
- Length of Service in present post and immediate = 5% (5 marks max.) lower post at the Institute

Formula for calculating the marks corresponding to 5%weightage for the length of service at the Institute is as follows:

- D. One Mark for every completed year beyond five years in the present post.
- E. One Mark for every completed year beyond ten years in the present post and in the immediate lower post taken together.
- F. Sum of Marks in Point No. A and B subject to maximum of 5 marks.

The above formula gives a slight advantage for the persons who served more than 5 years in the present post and served more than 10 years in the present post and in the immediate lower post taken together. (See Examples 1 & 2 or Examples 5 & 6)
